## 2001-02

**Week of Nov. 12-18:** Austin Nichols, Humboldt State (Guard, 6-5, So., Berkeley, CA) scored 53 points, including 33 in the title game as the Lumberjacks won the UC Davis Hamilton Invitational. Nichols, who was named to the all-tournament team, hit on 20 of 24 foul shots in HSU's two games and also had 12 rebounds and five assists.

**Week of Nov. 19-25:** Terry Thompson, Central Washington (6-3, Jr., Seattle, WA - Ingraham) was named the Most Valuable Player in the 42nd annual Chico State Invitational. Thompson scored 36 points, converting on 14 of 24 shots, including six of seven three-pointers. He also had six rebounds and seven steals as the Wildcats posted double-digit victories over Sonoma State and Chico State.

**Week of Nov. 26-Dec. 2:** Fred Hooks, Humboldt State (Forward, 6-5, So., San Diego, CA - Horizon) scored 59 points and also had 34 rebounds and 12 blocked shots as he led the Lumberjacks to a three victories, including two in the Ron Logsdon Classic at Rohnert Park. Hooks had 28 points, 10 rebounds, four assists, two steals and five blocks in a 11-point win over Southern Oregon on Tuesday. After a seven-point, nine-rebound output against Dominican in the opening game of the Logsdon Classic on Friday, Hooks, who leads the GNAC with four double-doubles, netted 24 points and had a GNAC season-high 15 rebounds and six blocks in 98-91 win over host Sonoma State to earn all-tournament honors.

**Week of Dec. 3-9:** Maurice Cato, Seattle Pacific (Guard, 6-0, Jr., Fairfield, CA - Skyline JC) scored 38 points, including 28 in a double overtime win over Central Washington, as the Falcons opened their conference season with road wins at CWU and Saint Martin's. All 28 of his points against CWU came in the second half. He made 12 of 13 foul shots against the Wildcats, including two with two seconds left in the second overtime session. In the two contests, he converted on 10 of 22 shots, including five-of-11 three-pointers. He also had four assists and four steals.

**Week of Dec. 10-16:** Yusef Aziz, Seattle Pacific (Forward, 6-4, Jr., Seattle, WA - Foster & Highline CC) and Austin Nichols, Humboldt State (Forward, 6-5, So., Berkeley, CA). . .Aziz scored 40 points and also had 10 rebounds as the Falcons won two games in the Las Vegas High Desert Classic. SPU handed eighth-ranked Henderson State its first loss of the season and also beat Ashland, Ohio, which came into the tournament with a 5-1 record. The Highline CC transfer scored 25 points (9-11 FG, 1-1 three-pointers, 6-7 FTs) against Henderson, including four in the final 35 seconds as SPU scored the game's final five points to break a 63-63 tie. In the two contests, he shot 72.7 percent from the floor (16-22) and 77.8 percent from the free throw line (7-9). . . Nichols scored 62 points (16-30 FG, 7-15 three-pointers, 23-25 FTs) as the Lumberjacks extended their winning streak to a school-record nine with road wins at Northwest Nazarene and Seattle. Nichols had a GNAC season-high 38 against the Crusaders, cashing in on nine of 12 field goal attempts (4 of 6 three-pointers) and 16 of 17

foul shots. His lone foul shot miss against NNU snapped a string of 24 consecutive free throws without a miss.

**Week of Dec. 17-23:** James Thomas Jr., Northwest Nazarene (Forward, 6-5, Sr., Houston, TX) scored 20 points and his dunk put the Crusaders ahead to stay in a 62-57 win over Seattle University. Thomas, who also had three assists, hit on four-of-nine three-point shots.

**Week of Dec. 24-30:** Yusef Aziz, Seattle Pacific (Forward, 6-4, Jr., Seattle, WA - Foster & HCC) and Peter Bullock, Alaska Anchorage (Forward, 6-6, So., Anchorage, AK - East). . .Aziz scored 37 points and also had 12 rebounds and eight steals as the Falcons extended their winning streak to 10 games with two wins in the Oak Harbor Classic. Aziz, who was named to the all-tournament team, made 13 of 21 shots, including two of five three-pointers. SPU's 10-game winning streak is its longest since it opened the 1993-94 season with 11 victories . . .Bullock had 53 points and 23 rebounds (15 at the offensive end) as the Seawolves lost a pair of home games to Angelo State. He had 17 points and 10 rebounds in Friday's 14-point loss and 36 points and 13 rebounds in Saturday's six-point defeat. The latter point total was the most for a UAA player since Jason Kaiser scored 36 against Hawaii Hilo on Feb. 18, 1995.

**Week of Dec. 31-Jan. 6:** A. J. Giesa, Western Washington (Forward, 6-7, Sr., Kennewick, WA) scored a game-high 20 points in a 104-76 win over Northwest Nazarene and tied for game-high scoring honors with 20 points in a 86-84 win over Seattle as the Vikings extended their winning streak to five with a pair of victories. Giesa shot 67 percent from the floor (16 of 24 including four of seven on three-pointers) and also had 10 rebounds and four assists.

**Week of Jan. 7-13:** Fred Hooks, Humboldt State (Forward, 6-5, So., San Diego, CA) and Gerrit Eades, Saint Martin's (Forward, 6-8, Sr., Bend, OR - Mountain View). . .Hooks, who set a PacWest record last year by snagging 29 rebounds against Hawaii Hilo, had the two best single-game rebound totals this winter in the GNAC, pulling down 20 against Alaska Fairbanks and 19 against Alaska Anchorage as the Lumberjacks extended their winning streak to 14. Hooks also scored 38 points in the two contests and also was credited with seven assists. . . Eades led the Saints to a pair of road wins, contributing 42 points (15-30 FG, 3-6 three-pointers) and 19 rebounds. He had a double-double (27 points, 10 rebounds) against Northwest Nazarene and scored 13 points in a 5 1/2 minute span as the Saints went on a 17-4 run to overcome an 11-point second-half deficit.

**Week of Jan. 14-20:** Mike Palm, Western Washington (Center, 6-10, 230, Jr., Puyallup, WA) and Brannon Stone, Seattle Pacific (Forward, 6-9, Sr., Oak Harbor). . .Palm had his fourth and fifth double-doubles of the season as he led the Vikings to their sixth and seventh wins in their last eight outings (their only loss during that stretch of games came at Seattle Pacific). He had season highs of 25 points and 14 rebounds in a 42-point win over UAF and also had 13 points and 10 rebounds (in just 20 minutes) in a 20-point

victory against UAA. In the two contests, Palm, who earlier this season had a GNAC-best free throw streak of 32 in a row, hit on 13 of 19 shots, including his first three-pointer in two seasons, and 11 of 14 free throws. He also reached the 1,000 point career plateau against UAF on his final shot, became the 17th player in Viking school history, including four from this year's roster, to accomplish that feat. . .Stone, who has taken on more of a playmaking role for the Falcons this winter, scored 31 points and also had 11 assists (and just one turnover), as SPU extended its winning streak to a school-record 15 with 25 and 31-point victories over UAF and UAA, respectively. He had team-highs of 17 points and 10 rebounds and also contributed five assists, one steal and two blocks against UAF. He then hit on four-of-six three-point shots and had 14 points and six assists against UAA. In the two contests, he made 12 of 20 shots, including half of his dozen tries from the three-point line.

**Week of Jan. 21-27:** Mark White, Humboldt State (Guard, 6-2, So., Bozeman, MT) and Kevin Richard, Northwest Nazarene (Forward, 6-5, Jr., Pasadena, CA). . .White guided the Lumberjacks to showdown wins over Seattle Pacific and Western Washington. The HSU point guard not only had an outstanding 5-to-1 assist to turnover ratio (10 assists, two turnovers), but was also productive scoring-wise, contributing a season-high 17 points in a six-point win against SPU and scoring 15 points - equaling his second highest output of the season - in a 100-86 conquest of WWU. In the two contests, the GNAC assist leader hit on seven of 15 shots, including three of seven three-pointers, and also made 15 of 16 foul shots. . .Richard had 45 points and 22 rebounds and shot 67.8 percent from the floor (19 of 28) helping the Crusaders gain a split in their road trip to Alaska. In a 15-point win at Fairbanks, Richard had 18 points and missed just one of nine shots. He also had six rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block. He followed that up with a 27-point, 16-rebound performance in a 10-point loss to Alaska Anchorage.

**Week of Jan. 28-Feb. 3:** Maurice Cato, Seattle Pacific (Guard, 6-0, Jr., Fairfield, CA - Skyline JC) and Mike Palm, Western Washington (Center, 6-10, Jr., Puyallup, WA - Rogers). . .Cato led the Falcons to two double-digit victories, contributing 35 points (game highs of 19 against Saint Martin's and 16 against Central Washington), seven assists and five steals. He played solid defense in the two contests and also helped stretch zones by hitting six of nine three-point shots. Overall, he made 11 of 17 shots and seven of eight free throws. . .Palm scored 47 points and grabbed 14 rebounds in a pair of wins. He was nearly perfect in a three-point victory over Central Washington, netting 31 points by hitting 10 of 11 field goal attempts and 11 of 12 foul shots. He also had a game-high 16 points (8-12 FGs) and eight rebounds in a 10-point win over Saint Martin's.

**Week of Feb. 4-10:** Gerrit Eades, Saint Martin's (Forward, 6-8, Sr., Bend, OR - Mountain View) scored 73 points and had 26 rebounds, accounting for 44.8 percent of the Saints' points and 33.3 percent of their rebounds in wins over Alaska Fairbanks and Alaska Anchorage. Eades had a

Great Northwest Athletic Conference season-best 46 points in a 97-64 win over UAA. He scored 29 second-half points, including 17 straight at one point. His point total was the second highest in school history and he also tied school marks for most attempts (32) and most three-pointers made (7). He also made a GNAC season-high 18 field goals and shot 77.8 percent from the three-point line.

**Week of Feb. 11-17:** Jacob Stevenson, Western Washington (Guard, 6-4, Sr., Bellingham - Sehome) and Jason Williams, Alaska Fairbanks (Forward, 6-8, Jr., St. Croix, Virgin Islands). . .Stevenson powered the Vikings to an eight-point must-win victory over Seattle Pacific, scoring 23 points and also contributing seven assists, five rebounds and four steals. His point total was his second highest of the season and his point, assist and steal totals were all game highs. . .Williams scored 20 points and had 19 rebounds - the second highest output in the GNAC this winter -- against Humboldt State. He also hit on five-of-six shots and had 11 points, eight rebounds and three steals against Western Oregon.

**Week of Feb. 18-24:** Eric Sandrin, Seattle Pacific (Center, 6-10, Sr., Bothell, WA - Shorecrest) and Jacob Stevenson, Western Washington (Guard, 6-4, Sr., Bellingham, WA - Sehome). . .Sandrin led the Falcons to their first road sweep of Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks in 11 years. In two games, he hit on 14 of 21 shots and scored 35 points. He also had 14 rebounds, seven assists, three blocks and three steals, despite seeing limited time in a lopsided 35-point win at Fairbanks. . .Stevenson hit two clutch free throws against Alaska Anchorage - in a one-and-one situation - with three seconds left as the Vikings won their seventh straight game to keep alive their post-season playoff hopes. In two games, he scored 39 points (13-23 FGs, 10-13 FTs) and also had 16 rebounds, 14 assists and seven steals. He had team highs in four different categories (18 points, 9 rebounds, 7 assists and 5 steals) in a come-from-behind win over UAF and in three categories (21 points, 7 assists, 2 steals) in a one-point win over UAA.

**Week of Feb. 25-Mar. 3:** Nick Johnson, Seattle Pacific (Guard, 6-3, Sr., Burlington, WA - Burlington-Edison) and Robert Day, Western Oregon (Guard, 6-5, So., Portland, OR - Benson). . .Johnson scored 40 points in two games as the Falcons earned a tie for the Great Northwest Athletic Conference title, by defeating Humboldt State 81-78 after losing to Western Oregon. Against the Wolves, he scored 22 of his 25 points in the second half, sparking a rally that erased a 17-point halftime deficit before falling behind again. Johnson then scored 15 against Humboldt, including the tying basket in the final minute, which set up a three-point shot at the buzzer by Maurice Cato. . .Day scored 54 points in two contests, including 26 in a 77-74 upset of SPU and 28 in a 76-65 loss at Western Washington. In the two contests, he hit on 18 of 32 shots, including seven of 12 three-pointers. He also made 11 of 13 foul shots.

## 2002-03

**Week of Nov. 19-25:** Brad Oleson, Alaska Fairbanks (6-0, So., North Pole, AK - Mt. San Jacinto) was named the

Most Valuable Player as he led the Nanooks to the title in the Top of the World Classic. Oleson scored 50 points (12-22 FGs, 3-8 three-pointers, 23-24 free throws) and also had 18 rebounds, 13 assists and 11 steals in wins over Wisconsin - Green Bay, Nebraska and Weber State as UAF became the first Division II school ever to win an eight-team Division I tournament.

**Week of Nov. 26-Dec. 1:** Peter Bullock, Alaska Anchorage (Forward, 6-6, Jr., Anchorage, AK - East) earned all-tournament honors in the Great Alaska Shootout averaging 23.7 points and 12.0 rebounds as he led the Seawolves to a 1-2 record in the Division I tournament. Bullock, who had 37 points and 13 rebounds in an eight-point loss to Wyoming, connected on 21 of 49 shots, including four of five three-pointers, and also had five assists, five blocks and nine steals.

**Week of Dec. 2-8:** Jason Chivers, Seattle Pacific (Center, 6-8, 255, So., Palmdale, CA - Highland) scored 32 points and also had 16 rebounds to lead the Falcons to road wins at Central Washington and Saint Martin's. In the two contests, Chivers connected on 13 of 19 shots and made six of eight free throws.

**Week of Dec. 9-15:** Terry Thompson, Central Washington (Guard, 6-4, Sr., Seattle, WA - Ingraham & Edmonds CC) led the Wildcats to a pair of wins over Lone Star Conference teams, including previously unbeaten Tarleton State, in the Las Vegas High Desert Classic. Thompson scored 22 points in each game and also had 14 rebounds, four assists and four steals. The CWU guard connected on 13 of 30 shots, including five of 13 three-pointers, and also made 13 of 15 free throws.

**Week of Dec. 16-22:** Darnell Lyons, Seattle (Guard-Forward, 6-4, Sr., Seattle, WA - Highline) scored 47 points and also had 10 rebounds, five assists and six steals as the Redhawks divided a pair of contests. SU's win over Pacific Lutheran was its sixth of the season, matching its 2001-02 win total.

**Week of Dec. 23-29:** Fred Hooks, Humboldt State (Forward, 6-6, Jr., San Diego, CA - Horizon) scored 16 points and also had a GNAC record 21 rebounds in a 100-58 road win at UC San Diego. Hooks, who also holds the PacWest rebound record of 29 set two years ago against Hawaii Hilo, broke his own GNAC record of 20 he set last year against Alaska Fairbanks and Central Washington.

**Week of Dec. 30-Jan. 5:** Jason Williams, Alaska Fairbanks (Forward, 6-8, Sr., St. Croix, Virgin Islands - Midland JC) was named the Most Valuable Player in the Glacier Classic at Anchorage as he led the Nanooks to the team title with a pair of double-digit victories. Williams scored 32 points and also had team-bests of 20 rebounds and 10 blocked shots in wins over Christian Brothers and Montevallo.

**Week of Jan. 6-12:** Maurice Tyree, Western Washington (Forward, 6-7, So., Sacramento, CA - Jesuit) scored 20 points and also pulled down seven rebounds to lead the Vikings to a seven-point win at Seattle Pacific. Tyree hit on

nine of 13 shots as WWU won for only the third time in its last 13 outings at Royal Brougham. In two games, including a non-conference home win, Tyree had 30 points, 13 rebounds, six steals and four assists and hit on 70 percent of his shots (14-20). He played just 14 minutes in the non-conference contest.

**Week of Jan. 13-19:** Scott Freymond, Central Washington (Guard, 6-2, Jr., Elma, WA - Whatcom CC) scored 31 points and shot 61.1 percent leading the Wildcats to a pair of victories, including a 16-point over previously unbeaten and No. 1 ranked Humboldt State. Freymond hit on six of nine shots and scored 18 points against the Lumberjacks. He hit on three-of-five three-pointers and scored 13 points, including the game-winning basket from 15 feet with eight seconds left in overtime in a 78-77 win against Western Oregon.

**Week of Jan. 20-26:** Darnell Lyons, Seattle (Guard, 6-4, Sr., Seattle - Foster & Highline CC) and Austin Nichols, Humboldt State (Forward, 6-6, Jr., Berkeley, CA). . Lyons scored 54 points, including a career-high 30 in a 67-64 win over Saint Martin's. He also had 24 points, including 19 in the second half, as the Redhawks rallied from an 18-point first-half deficit to beat Central Washington 91-89 in overtime. In the two contests, Lyons connected on 19 of 36 shots, including five of nine three-pointers. . Nichols scored 52 points as the Lumberjacks extended their home winning streak to 27 with 76-69 and 80-70 victories over Western Washington and Seattle Pacific, respectively. Nichols, who had 28 points against the Vikings and 24 against the Falcons, shot at a 55.6 percent clip (15 of 27) and also cashed in on 19 of 25 foul shots.

**Week of Jan. 27-Feb. 2:** Jason Williams, Alaska Fairbanks (Forward, 6-8, Sr., St. Croix, Virgin Islands) scored 41 points and pulled down 28 rebounds to lead the Nanooks, who are unbeaten in 10 games at the Patty Center, to home wins over Western Oregon and Humboldt State. Williams hit on 17 of 27 shots and seven of nine free throws. He had 17 points and 11 rebounds in the Nanooks' three-point win over Humboldt State

**Week of Feb. 3-9:** Yusef Aziz, Seattle Pacific (Forward, 6-4, Sr., Seattle, WA) and Sean Kelly, Western Oregon (Guard, 6-5, So., Grand Junction, CO). . Aziz scored 19 of his 28 points in the second half to spark a come-from-behind road win at Western Washington. Aziz scored 11 points during a decisive 20-6 run in which the Falcons went from six down to an eight-point lead in the final nine minutes. He tied a school record by hitting all 12 of his free throws and was eight of 12 from the floor. He also had seven rebounds and three steals. . Kelly, who leads the GNAC in scoring, netted 47 points and also had team-highs in rebounds (12) and blocked shots (3) in WOU's road sweep of Northwest Nazarene and Seattle University.

**Week of Feb. 10-16:** Mike Palm, Western Washington (Center, 6-10, Sr., Puyallup, WA) and Peter Bullock, Alaska Anchorage (Forward, 6-6, Jr., Anchorage, AK - East). . Palm scored 60 points and also pulled down 31 rebounds as the Vikings earned a split on their Alaska road

trip, losing to Alaska Anchorage despite a career-tying best 35 points by Palm and then handing Alaska Fairbanks its first home loss in 12 games. Palm, who also had nine blocked shots, hit on 25 of 34 shots and connected on nine of 10 free throws. The Puyallup product now has career totals of 1,544 points and 814 rebounds. He is the fourth Viking in school history to reach the 1,500 point plateau and he ranks first in career rebounds, surpassing the former leader Jim Adams, who had 800 between 1960 and 1963. .Bullock led the way with 35 points (15-31 FG) and 20 rebounds as UAA kept alive its post-season hopes with a two-point win over WWU and a six-point overtime win against Seattle Pacific. The two wins moved the Seawolves into a second-place tie with state rival Alaska Fairbanks. UAA hosts UAF this Saturday at the UAA Sports Center.

**Week of Feb. 17-23:** Jesse Keely, Seattle Pacific (Forward, 6-7, Sr., Fircrest, CA - Bellarmine Prep) and Steve Towne, Alaska Fairbanks (Guard, 6-2, Sr., Bothell, WA - Peninsula JC). .Keely scored 38 points and grabbed 18 rebounds in a quadruple overtime victory over Humboldt State and a two-point win against Western Oregon. Against the Lumberjacks, he had a career-high and team-high 22 points, including seven in the third and fourth overtimes, and also contributed 11 rebounds and four steals. He then scored a team-high 16 points, connecting on 10 of 10 free throws, against Western Oregon. .Towne made five of eight three-pointers and scored 26 points as the Nanooks completed a two-game series sweep of Alaska Anchorage. Towne hit two free throws with 5.3 seconds left following a steal by Chris Smith to provide the final three-point margin of victory.

**Week of Feb. 24-Mar. 2:** Brandon Hartley, Saint Martin's (Guard, 6-3, Jr., Phoenix, AZ) and Robert Day, Western Oregon (Guard, 6-5, Jr., Portland, OR - Benson). .Hartley scored 36 points, including eight in overtime, and also pulled down 11 rebounds to lead the Saints to a 83-80 win at Ellensburg, ending Central Washington's post-season hopes. Hartley's point total is the fifth best single-game total this winter in the GNAC. His basket with 32 seconds left in overtime put the Saints ahead to stay. .Day led the Wolves to a pair of home wins against Alaska Fairbanks and Alaska Anchorage, finishing with 48 points, seven rebounds, four assists and a team-high seven steals.

**Week of Mar. 3-9:** Jason Williams, Alaska Fairbanks (Forward, 6-8, Sr., St. Croix, Virgin Islands) scored 52 points and also had 24 rebounds, four blocked shots and five steals as the Nanooks earned a tie for the conference title with wins over Northwest Nazarene and Seattle University. Williams hit on 20 of 29 shots and had 13 offensive rebounds.

**Week of Nov. 17-23:** Evan Kieling, Western Oregon (Forward, 6-6, Jr., Gladstone, OR – Clackamas CC) and Peter Bullock, Alaska Anchorage (Forward, 6-6, Sr., Anchorage, AK – East) .Kieling converted on 13 of 15

shots and had 32 points and 13 rebounds to lead Western Oregon to a pair of victories in a tournament at Ellensburg. Bullock was named the MVP in the AT&T Alascom Jamboree as he had 74 points and 35 rebounds to lead the Seawolves to three wins, including two against Hawaii Pacific. Bullock hit on 23 of 37 shots and also cashed in on 26 of 34 free throws.

**Week of Nov. 24-30:** Peter Bullock, Alaska Anchorage (Forward, 6-6, Sr., Anchorage, AK - East) was the leading scorer (60) and rebounder (34) in the Great Alaska Shootout as he led the Seawolves to a fourth place finish with two victories. Bullock connected on 24 of 56 shots and had four assists and five steals and was named to the all-tournament team for the third year in a row.

**Week of Dec. 8-14:** Derek Olich, Northwest Nazarene (Guard, 5-11, Jr., Phoenix, AZ) scored 12 points and also had seven rebounds, eight assists and four steals as the Crusaders stayed unbeaten with a three-point West Region victory over Grand Canyon. Olich currently leads the GNAC in both assists (9.17) and steals (3.17) in sparking NNU to a 6-0 start.

**Week of Dec. 15-21:** Aaron Lawrence, Alaska Anchorage (Guard, 5-11, Jr., Sacramento, CA) and Robert Day, Western Oregon (Forward, 6-5, Sr., Portland, OR – Benson). .Lawrence scored 34 points, connecting on six of nine three-pointers, and also had 17 assists, nine rebounds and five steals as the Seawolves won three games in Hawaii, defeating Notre Dame de Namur and region rivals Chaminade and Hawaii Pacific. The junior transfer from West Valley JC in California scored a career-high 21 points in UAA's win over Chaminade as the Seawolves rallied from a 23-point deficit. .Day produced only the second triple-double in the three-year history of the GNAC as he had 21 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists in a six-point home win over Montana State-Billings.

**Week of Dec. 29-Jan. 4:** Brad Oleson, Alaska Fairbanks (Guard, 6-4, Jr., North Pole, AK) earned MVP honors in the Glacier Classic at Fairbanks. Oleson scored 51 points, hitting on 16 of 29 shots including six of 13 three-pointers, as the Nanooks won a pair of contests. Oleson also had 12 rebounds, nine assists and four steals.

**Week of Jan. 5-11:** Brandon Hartley, Saint Martin's (Guard, 6-3, 180, Sr., Phoenix, AZ – South Mountain CC) and Jason Chivers, Seattle Pacific (Center, 6-8, Jr., Palmdale, CA – Highland). .Hartley, who leads the GNAC

in scoring (24.2), tallied 59 points to pace the Saints to a pair of home wins over Northwest Nazarene and Seattle University. Hartley netted 31 points in a 12-point win over the Crusaders, then had 28 points, six rebounds, five assists and four steals in a seven-point victory against the Redhawks. . . Chivers had 40 points, 20 rebounds and four blocks shots as the Falcons earned a split with the top two teams in the conference, defeating nationally second-ranked Humboldt State by six points after losing to Western Oregon by the same margin. Chivers scored 15 of his 22 points against Humboldt in the second half, after first half foul problems limited his playing time and helped bring a halt to his seven-game double-double streak. He had 18 points and 14 rebounds against the Wolves and accounted for one-third of SPU's rebound total for the two-game set.

He had a team-high three steals against UAA.

**Week of Jan. 19-25:** Kemmy Burgess, Alaska Anchorage (Guard, 6-1, Jr., San Diego, CA – El Cajon), Brad Oleson, Alaska Fairbanks (Guard, 6-4, Jr., North Pole, AK) and Jason Burrell, Western Washington (Guard, 6-1, Sr., Ontario, CA). . . Burgess scored 32 points, 16 apiece in two- and one-point wins over Northwest Nazarene and Seattle, respectively. Against Northwest Nazarene, Burgess scored eight points in the final two minutes including a three-pointer to tie the game with four seconds left. His 16 points on Saturday was 30.8 percent of UAA's total and came on a night when no other player on either team scored more than 10. For the weekend, he made 11 of 20 shots, including six of 10 treys, and also had eight rebounds, 10 assists and just three turnovers. . . Oleson scored 53 points, connecting of 18 of 26 shots including seven of 11 three-pointers, as the Nanooks swept past Seattle and edged Northwest Nazarene. **Week of Feb. 2-8:** Austin Nichols, Humboldt State (Forward, 6-6, Sr., Berkeley, CA) and Sean Kelly, Western Oregon (Forward, 6-5, Sr., Grand Junction, CO). . . Nichols

scored 59 points, including 30 in a nine-point win over Seattle Pacific as the Lumberjacks beat the Falcons and Western Washington to open up a three-game lead in the GNAC race. Nichols hit on 20 of 29 shots, including six of nine three-pointers, as he increased his career scoring total to 2,247 points. . . Kelly had 55 points converting on 21 of 32 shots including six of eight three-pointers as the Wolves kept alive their post-season playoff hopes with a pair of wins. Kelly, who had 31 points in an eight-point win over Seattle Pacific, also had nine rebounds, 10 assists and six steals.

**Week of Feb. 9-15:** Andrew Smith, Alaska Fairbanks (Forward, 6-8, So., Anchorage, AK – Bartlett) and Dustin Bremerman, Seattle Pacific (Forward, 6-4, Fr., Yakima, WA – Eisenhower). . . Smith scored 43 points, including 26 in a seven-point win over nationally third-ranked Humboldt State. His turnaround jumper with less than a minute to play gave UAF a 65-61 lead against the Lumberjacks. Oleson scored 52 points (35 percent of the Nanooks' total) as Alaska Fairbanks extended its winning streak to six with road wins at Northwest Nazarene and Seattle. In the two contests, Oleson connected on 17 of 24 shots, including eight of 12 three-pointers. He also led the Nanooks with 13 rebounds, nine assists and nine steals.

Oleson scored 60 points as the Nanooks won a pair of road games to finish the regular-season with a 10-game win streak. Oleson connected on 19 of 29 shots, including nine of 12 three-pointers. He also hit on 13 of 14 free throws and had 13 assists and eight rebounds. Hooks scored 41 points and pulled down 25 rebounds as the Lumberjacks wrapped up

their third consecutive GNAC title with road wins at Central Washington and Saint Martin's.

**Week of Mar. 8-14:** Austin Nichols, Humboldt State (Forward, 6-6, Sr., Berkeley, CA) scored 73 points, including 30 in the championship game to earn Most Valuable Player honors in the NCAA West Regional at San Bernardino. **Week of Nov. 1-7:** Brad Oleson, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-4, Sr., North Pole, AK – Peninsula) scored 48 points (in just 46 minutes) to lead the Nanooks to 70 and 68-point victories over Puget Sound Christian. Oleson connected on 17 of 24 shots, including six of 12 three-pointers, and also had 12 rebounds and 10 assists.

**Week of Nov. 15-21:** Grant Dykstra, Western Washington (G, 6-4, Jr., Everson, WA – Lynden Christian) earned MVP honors in leading the Vikings to two West Region victories in the Sonoma State Ron Logsdon Classic at Rohnert Park. Dykstra had 34 points, 13 rebounds and eight assists in wins over Cal State Stanislaus and the host Seawolves. In three wins, including a home victory over Northwest, Dykstra netted 54 points and also had 20 rebounds, nine assists and five steals. He hit on 20 of 36 shots, including six of 10 treys.

**Week of Nov. 22-28:** Niko Nunogawa, Saint Martin's (F, 6-6, Jr., Federal Way, WA – Tacoma CC) and Grant Dykstra, Western Washington (G, 6-4, Jr., Everson, WA – Lynden Christian). .Nunogawa scored 37 points and also had 12 rebounds as the Saints won a pair of games, including a region contest with nationally-ranked Cal Poly Pomona, in the WWU Chuck Randall Thanksgiving Classic. He connected on 15 of 24 shots, including two of three three-pointers, to earn all-tournament honors. Dykstra was selected the MVP – his second MVP award in two weeks – as he led the Vikings to their fourth and fifth consecutive wins in the Randall Classic. Dykstra scored 39 points and also had 11 rebounds, nine assists and four steals in wins over Pacific Lutheran and Cal Poly Pomona. Dykstra made seven of 11 three-pointers in the event.

**Week of Nov. 29-Dec. 5:** Brad Oleson, Alaska Fairbanks (G-F, 6-4, Sr., North Pole, AK – Peninsula College) led the Nanooks to double-digit home wins against Humboldt State and Western Oregon. Oleson had GNAC season-bests of 35 points and seven steals in a 19-point win over the Wolves. He finished the two-game weekend set with 48 points (20-29 FGs, 4-10 three-pointers), eight rebounds, seven assists and nine steals. His seven steals against WOU equaled the third best total in GNAC history and also equaled the UAF school record he previously shared with current head coach Frank Ostanik.

**Week of Dec. 6-12:** Mesut Ademoglu, Northwest Nazarene (F, 6-9, Jr., Istanbul, Turkey) scored 12 second-half points

to lead the Crusaders to a come-from-behind win over perennial West Region Division II contender Cal State Bakersfield. In two games, including a narrow two-point loss to unbeaten Montana State – Billings, Ademoglu had 30 points, 11 rebounds and five assists. He converted on 11 of 19 field goal attempts (57.9).

**Week of Dec. 13-19:** Jordan Lee, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Life Christina) and Tyler Amaya, Western Washington (F, 6-7, Jr., Mount Vernon, WA – Gonzaga). .Lee scored 38 points, connecting on 67 percent of his shots (14-21) in wins over Cal State Bakersfield and previously unbeaten Central Missouri State at the High Desert Classic. Lee, who made four of eight three-pointers, also had four rebounds and three steals. He finished with 28 points against Bakersfield, scoring SPU's final eight points to stave off a late Roadrunner rally. .Amaya had 36 points and 16 rebounds as the Vikings divided a pair of games at Vegas. Amaya connected on 15 of 29 shots, including six of 10 treys, and also had five steals. He had 28 points and 10 rebounds to rally the Vikings back from a 10-point second-half deficit in Sunday's win over previously unbeaten Cal State Stan Bernardino.

**Week of Dec. 27-Jan. 2:** Lance Den Boer, Central Washington (F, 6-6, So., Sunnyside, WA – Sunnyside Christian) and Kevin Johnson, Humboldt State (F, 6-7, So., Oakland, CA – Liberty). .Den Boer scored 39 points and also had 12 rebounds, four assists and three blocks in earning MVP honors in the Red Lion Hotel-Fibromyalgia Classic at Monmouth. He had 17 points and six rebounds as CWU, which had won just two previous games, upset nationally second-ranked Minnesota State – Mankato 88-78 before defeating CCAA member Cal State L.A. 71-57. .Johnson scored 21 points and also had 15 rebounds, four blocks and four steals as the Lumberjacks beat No. 9 nationally ranked Brigham Young – Hawaii. In the final 20 seconds of the game, Johnson hit a three-pointer to put HSU on top, grabbed a key rebound on the other end of the floor, hit a pair of free throws and then blocked a shot that could have sent the game to overtime.

**Week of Jan. 3-9:** Kyle Boast, Central Washington (G, 6-5, 215, Sr., Spokane, WA – Central Valley) scored 47 points (19-34 FGs, 6-12 three-pointers) and also had 31 rebounds and five steals as the Wildcats knocked off the No. 1 and No. 3 ranked teams in the West Region. Boast had 27 points and 15 rebounds, connecting on 10 of 16 shots, including five of eight three-pointers, in a 11-point win over Seattle Pacific. He then scored 20 points and pulled down 16 more rebounds in a five-point squeaker over nationally 10th -ranked Western Washington before a crowd of 3,365 in Ellensburg.

**Week of Jan. 10-16:** Evan Kieling, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, Sr., Gladstone, OR) scored 49 points and also had 15 rebounds, four assists and a block leading the Wolves to 10 and 11-point home wins over Seattle University and Northwest Nazarene. Kieling, who had a career-high 29 against the Redhawks, connected on 18 of 28 shots, including four of nine three-pointers in the two contests.

**Week of Jan. 17-23:** Tony Binetti, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, Jr., Enumclaw, WA) and Ryan Diggs, Western Washington (G, 6-2, Jr., Victorville, CA) led their respective teams to two home wins, including victories over nationally 16th ranked Alaska Fairbanks. Binetti had 46 points, missing just four shots, as the Falcons beat Alaska Anchorage by 15 and Alaska Fairbanks in overtime. He hit on 13 of 17 shots (4 of 6 three-pointers) and 16 of 20 free throws. He also had a team-best 12 assists. Diggs shot at a 60 percent pace (18-30) as he scored 49 points including 22 in a nine-point win over UAF and 27 in a 10-point win against UAA. He also had 10 assists and six rebounds.

**Week of Jan. 24-30:** Bim Makinde, Seattle University (G, 6-1, Sr., Phoenix, AZ – Paradise Valley) and Brad Oleson, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-4, Sr., North Pole, AK). .Makinde scored 43 points as the Redhawks handed Central Washington and Saint Martin's losses. He had 22 points against the Saints, including a decisive three-point play with eight seconds remaining to give the Redhawks' their first and only lead of the game. He also had 21 against the Wildcats. In the two contests, Bim connected on 16 of 32 shots and also had nine rebounds and four assists. . Oleson scored a GNAC season-best 39 points, connecting on eight of 11 three-pointers, and also had a team-best nine rebounds, to carry the Nanooks to an 11-point win over arch-rival Alaska Anchorage. Oleson also had two steals to improve his career total to 197, six short of the GNAC record.

**Week of Jan. 31-Feb. 6:** Jason Chivers, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-8, 240, Sr., Los Angeles, CA – Highland & LA Trade) scored 52 points and also had 29 rebounds as the Falcons solidified their No. 2 regional ranking with 13 and seven point wins over Saint Martin's and Central Washington, respectively. Chivers, who equaled a GNAC single-game record for conference contests with 20 rebounds against the Saints, connected on 22 of 31 shots (71.0 percent) as he increased his career point total to 1,032.

**Week of Feb. 7-13:** Mesut Ademoglu, Northwest Nazarene (F, 6-9, Jr., Istanbul, Turkey) and Ryan Diggs, Western Washington (G, 6-2, Jr., Victorville, CA – Silverdale). .Ademoglu scored 36 points, converting on 16 of 28 shots, and also had 16 rebounds and eight steals as the Crusaders earned wins against Western Oregon and Humboldt State, snapping a 17-game losing streak against the Lumberjacks and resurrecting their post-season playoff hopes. Diggs scored 18 of his game-high 25 points in the first half as the Vikings built a 25-point lead, then hit a key basket with 2:10 left after SPU had closed the deficit to two points, as the Vikings held on for a four-point win moving into a tie with SPU for first-place.

**Week of Feb. 14-20:** Brad Oleson, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-4, Sr., North Pole, AK - Peninsula) scored 51 points, leading the Nanooks to eight-point home wins over a pair of nationally ranked teams – No. 17 Seattle Pacific and No. 18 Western Washington. Oleson, who had 24 points against SPU and 27 against WWU, connected on 18 of 30 shots and 10 of 11 free throws. He also had nine rebounds, six

assists and two steals as the Nanooks moved half a game ahead of both the Falcons and Vikings in the GNAC race.

**Week of Feb. 21-27:** Bernard Seals, Seattle University (G, 6-3, Jr., Sacramento, CA – Consumnes River) and Mark Drake, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-1, Sr., Shelbyville, Ind.). .Seals scored 54 points as the Redhawks earned only their second and third road wins of the season. He made 13 of 23 three-pointers, eight of them in a 33-point performance against Central Washington. Seals also had 10 rebounds and four steals. . Drake scored 32 points as the Seawolves knocked Alaska Fairbanks out of a tie for first place with a one-point win. He was 10 of 11 from the foul line, including one with five seconds remaining to give UAA a four-point lead and seal the victory. Drake, who hit four of seven three-pointers and also had five assists, increased his career point total to 1,145. His lone miss snapped a string of 28 consecutive free throws made. He has had two 30-point games this season and four in his career.

**Week of Feb. 28-Mar. 6:** Mesut Ademoglu, Northwest Nazarene (C, 6-9, Jr., Istanbul, Turkey) netted 54 points on 21 of 31 shooting and also had 23 rebounds and eight assists as the Crusaders finished their season with wins over a pair of playoff-bound teams. He had nearly identical numbers in victories over Seattle Pacific (27 points, 11 rebounds) and Western Washington (27 points, 12 rebounds), recording his eighth and ninth double-doubles of the season.

**Week of Mar. 7-14:** Justin Bourne, Alaska Fairbanks (Forward, 6-7, Jr., Fairbanks, AK – Lathrop) scored 42 points and also pulled down 24 rebounds helping lead the Nanooks to a runner-up finish in the NCAA Division II West Regional at Bellingham. Bourne, who connected on 13 of 21 shots, had a 14-point, 10-rebound double-double in a seven-point win over Cal State Bernardino, scored 20 points in a 22-point win over top-seeded Western Washington and then netted eight points and a team-best nine rebounds in Monday's championship game loss to Cal Poly Pomona.

## 2005-06

**Week of Nov. 14-20:** Kevin Tyner, Western Oregon (G, 6-0, Sr., Portland, OR – Central Catholic) and Dustin Bremerman, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-4, Jr., Yakima, WA – Eisenhower). .Tyner scored 76 points (29-52 FGs, 4-12 3-pointers, 14-16 FTs) in three games, including 49 in two games at the Wildcat Classic to win MVP honors. He also had 21 assists, 12 rebounds and 13 steals. Twice he rallied the Wolves back from big second-half deficits. His three-pointer at the buzzer was the difference in Friday's 88-87 win over Grand Canyon. . Bremerman had back-to-back 30-point performances – the first such occurrence for a SPU player since Jeff McBroom accomplished the feat in the 1998-99 season – to lead the Falcons to a pair of wins over Monterey Bay and San Bernardino in the Sodexo Classic. He made 20 of 31 shots, including nine of 16 three-pointers, and was perfect from the foul line (13-13) extending his two-season streak to 18 straight in earning

all-tournament honors. His 32 points against CSUMB was a career-high.

**Week of Nov. 21-27:** Ryan Diggs, Western Washington (G, 6-2, Sr., Victorville, CA – Silverado) and Bernard Seals, Seattle (G, 6-3, Sr., Sacramento, CA – Cosumnes River). .Diggs scored 60 points, including 31 in a seven-point win over Sonoma State, to win MVP honors in the Chuck Randall Thanksgiving Classic. Half of his points came at the foul line where he made 30 of 33. He also was 14 of 24 from the floor and also had 10 assists, seven rebounds and seven steals. Diggs now ranks 11th in GNAC history in career scoring with 1,259 points. .Seals hit on five of nine three-pointers, including one with 4:07 left to tie the game, and finished with a game-high 23 points as the Redhawks upset Division I Portland 88-85. He also had three rebounds and three steals. The win was SU's first official victory over a Division I school since it left the NCAA Division I ranks prior to the 1980-81 season.

**Week of Nov. 28-Dec. 4:** Travis Kuhns, Western Oregon (F, 6-8, Fr., Salem, OR – Sprague) earned all-tournament honors at the Red Lion Hotel Classic in Monmouth, scoring 43 points and also pulling down 11 rebounds as the Wolves split a pair of games, defeating Alderson-Broaddus 77-76 before losing to Chaminade 85-73. Kuhns, who is averaging 16.0 points per game, shot 57.1 percent from the floor, making 16 of 28, including seven of 13 from the three-point line.

**Week of Dec. 5-11:** Kevin Johnson, Humboldt State (F, 6-7, Jr., Oakland, CA – Liberty) scored 45 points and also had 20 rebounds and five blocked shots as the Lumberjacks split a pair of games in the Ron Logsdon Classic at Rohnert Park. Johnson, who made 16 of 30 shots, had 29 points, eight rebounds and three steals in an 11-point win over Cal State Monterey Bay after contributing 16 points, 12 rebounds and five blocks against Sonoma State. His fifth block came with two seconds left on a potential game-winning shot. Sonoma, however, then scored on an in-bounds lob player to earn the one-point victory.

**Week of Dec. 12-18:** Tony Binetti, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, Sr., Enumclaw, WA) and Jeremiah Ward, Humboldt State (G, 6-1, Jr., Fontana, CA – Miller). .Binetti missed only three shots in leading the Falcons to wins over Missouri Southern and Pittsburgh State in the High Desert Classic. The Falcon point guard made 12 of 15 attempts, including seven of eight three-pointers. He also had five assists and four steals. In three games, including a loss to Nevada, he netted 53 points and shot at a 70.8 clip (17-24). .Ward was named the Most Valuable Player in the DeBeni Classic at Arcata. In double-digit wins over Chico State and nationally second-ranked Tarleton State, he had 35 points connecting on 12 of 23 shots including seven of 14 three-pointers. He also had five steals and was charged with just two turnovers.

**Week of Dec. 19-25:** Kemmy Burgess, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-1, Sr., San Diego, CA – El Cajon) connected on 10 of 21 three-point shots and scored 50 points as the Seawolves swept Walla Walla College to finish their non-conference

schedule with a 9-3 record. Burgess, who also had nine assists in the two-game series, is the GNAC career leader in three-pointers made per game, averaging 3.24. He also currently ranks second in career three-point percentage (47.4) and ranks 11th in career scoring per game (16.9).

**Week of Dec. 26-Jan. 1:** Lance Den Boer, Central Washington (F, 6-6, Jr., Sunnyside, WA – Sunnyside Christian) and Tyler Amaya, Western Washington (F, 6-6, Sr., Mount Vernon, WA – Gonzaga). .Den Boer scored 50 points, connecting on 19 of 30 shots including eight of 10 three-pointers, in wins over nationally 22nd ranked Alaska Fairbanks and Alaska Anchorage. He had 30 points (on 11 of 15 shooting) against the Nanooks, including the first 10 points during a 16-4 run late in the first half and early in the second half as the Wildcats opened up a 10-point lead. He then added 20 in a one-point win over the Seawolves. .Amaya had 51 points and 12 rebounds as the Vikings extended their win streak to nine defeating UAA 112-106 in overtime and Alaska Fairbanks 95-86. Amaya, who made 15 of 25 shots in the two contests, had a career-high 32 against the Seawolves, 20 of them in the second half and overtime.

**Week of Jan. 2-8:** Mike Bushmaker, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-7, Sr., Yakima, WA – Eisenhower) and Andrew Smith, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-8, Sr., Anchorage, AK – Bartlett). .Bushmaker came off the bench to score 41 points, including a career-high 27 against Humboldt State, to lead the Falcons to a pair of road wins at Monmouth and Arcata. He missed just three shots converting on 15 of 18 attempts, including nine of 11 against the Lumberjacks. He also had eight rebounds, three assists and blocked three shots. .Smith had 35 points (10-18 FGs, 15-23 FTs) and 22 rebounds as the Nanooks beat Saint Martin's and Seattle to level their conference record at 2-2. He also had five assists, two blocks and two steals. Smith currently ranks 20th in career scoring (1,125), 18th in rebounding (468) and 10th in blocked shots (88) in GNAC history.

**Week of Jan. 9-15:** Tony Binetti, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, Sr., Enumclaw, WA) and Ryan Diggs, Western Washington (G, 6-2, Sr., Victorville, CA – Silverado). .Binetti scored 41 points and also had 15 assists and six steals to lead the Falcons to a sweep of Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks. He hit a key three with 24 seconds left in a 87-80 win over UAA and scored seven points in a 16-3 run early in the second half against UAF to help blow open the game. .Diggs scored 42 points against Seattle – the fifth highest total in GNAC history – to help rally the Vikings from a 15-point first-half deficit. In two contests, he netted 56 points, connecting on 17 of 25 shots, including four of nine three-pointers. He also made 18 of 22 foul shots and also contributed seven assists, six rebounds and five steals.

**Week of Jan. 16-22:** Tyler Amaya, Western Washington (F, 6-6, Sr., Mount Vernon, WA) had 35 points and 25 rebounds as the Vikings extended their win streak to 14 games, equaling their second longest streak in school history. Amaya, who also had seven assists, scored 19

points and produced his second 19-rebound game of the season in Saturday's 11-point win over Seattle Pacific.

**Week of Jan. 23-29:** Grayson Moyer, Humboldt State (G, 6-5, So., San Diego, CA) had back-to-back 30-point games as the Lumberjacks beat Central Washington and Western Washington, snapping the latter's GNAC record-tying 15-game win streak. Moyer had 30 points against the Wildcats, including nine during an 18-2 run early in the second half, as the 'Jacks rallied from a 10-point halftime deficit. He then scored a career-high 32 and added eight assists against the Vikings. In the two games, he made 17 of 24 shots, including five of 11 three-pointers, and also converted on 23 of 25 foul shots.

**Week of Jan. 30-Feb. 5:** Robbie Will, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-10, So., Seattle, WA - O'Dea) scored 38 points, including a career-high 22 points in a 15-point home win over Western Oregon. Will made 16 of 22 shots, including eight of nine against the Wolves, and also had 14 rebounds and five blocked shots as the Falcons improved to 18-2 with a pair of home victories.

**Week of Feb. 6-12:** Kemmy Burgess, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-1, Sr., San Diego, CA - El Cajon) had a pair of 22-point games in home wins over Northwest Nazarene and regionally top-ranked Seattle Pacific. In the two contests, he connected on 16 of 33 shots, was perfect from the foul line (9-9) and also had 10 assists and three steals as the Seawolves rejuvenated their playoff hopes. The two 22-point efforts left him exactly 22 points short of the career 1000-point milestone.

**Week of Feb. 13-19:** Lance Den Boer, Central Washington (F, 6-6, Jr., Sunnyside, WA - Sunnyside Christian) and Mesut Ademoglu, Northwest Nazarene (C, 6-10, Sr., Istanbul, Turkey)....Den Boer scored 56 points and had 19 rebounds and five steals leading Wildcats to road wins at Northwest Nazarene and Seattle Pacific. Den Boer made 15 of 27 field goal attempts, including nine of 12 three pointers. He also connected on 17 of 19 foul shots. . .Ademoglu scored 67 points as the Crusaders earned a split by defeating nationally second-ranked Western Washington after losing to the Wildcats. He had a career-high 34 against CWU, then netted 33 in a one-point win over Western. In the two contests, he made 22 of 39 shots, including seven of 13 treys. He also had 19 rebounds and five steals.

**Week of Feb. 20-26:** Jeffrey McDaniel, Seattle University (F, 6-6, Sr., Stockton, CA - Tokay) scored 39 points and also had 19 rebounds, five assists, three blocks and three steals in leading the Redhawks to wins over regionally top-ranked Seattle Pacific and Northwest Nazarene. McDaniel had 29 points, connecting on 11 of 17 shots, and 14 rebounds in a 90-76 win over the Falcons. McDaniel, who has 1,246 career points, became the sixth player in GNAC history to corral 700 or more rebounds, running his total to 713.

**Week of Feb. 27-Mar. 5:** Kemmy Burgess, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-1, Sr., San Diego, CA - El Cajon) and

Kenny Barker, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-2, So., San Diego, CA - Clairemont). . .Burgess scored 65 points, recording his third and fourth 30-point games of the year. He had 34 in Saturday's four-point win over Western Washington after scoring 31 Thursday in a three-point loss to Central Washington. In the two contests, he made 23 of 40 shots, seven of 13 from the three-point line. He also had eight assists. . .Barker scored 39 points, making seven of 12 three-pointers, as the Nanooks beat both the Vikings and Wildcats. In the two contests, he made 12 of 22 shots and also had 15 rebounds and eight assists.

**Week of Mar. 6-12:** Robbie Will, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-10, So., Seattle, WA - O'Dea) was named the Most Valuable Player in the NCAA Division II West region tournament, finishing with 54 points, 28 rebounds and nine blocks leading the Falcons to the title and a trip to Springfield, Mass., for the Elite Eight. Will made 21 of 31 shots and 12 of 13 free throws.

Week of Nov. 13-19: Sam Kirby, Seattle (G, 6-0, Sr., Sacramento, CA - San Joaquin Delta) and Rob Will, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-10, Jr., Seattle, WA - O'Dea) . . .Kirby scored 47 points to lead the Redhawks to wins over Sonoma State and Ashland in the Elgin Baylor Classic. Kirby made 17 of 29 shots, including 11 of 18 three-pointers. He also had five rebounds and four steals. . .Will led the Falcons to two wins over CCAA teams in the SPU Sodexo Classic, finishing with 32 points, 11 rebounds and nine blocks. Will hit 13 of 16 shots. His nine blocks all came against CSLA, breaking both the SPU and GNAC single-game records.

## 2006-07

**Week of Nov. 20-26:** Lukas Henne, Western Washington (C, 6-7, Sr., Bremerton, WA - Central Kitsap) scored 51 points to earn MVP honors in the WWU Chuck Randall Classic. Henne hit on 15 of 26 field goals and 19 of 20 free throws and also had 19 rebounds and five blocks in wins over Northwest and Grand Canyon.

**Week of Nov. 27-Dec. 3:** Dustin Bremerman, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-4, Sr., Yakima, WA - Eisenhower) scored a career-high 43 points and tied the SPU school record for three-pointers made (9) in a 98-93 win over previously unbeaten BYU-Hawaii. His two treys in the final 62 seconds of regulation helped force the OT. He then scored eight of SPU's 14 points in the extra session. His point total equaled the fifth highest in GNAC history and his three-point total equaled the second best mark in conference history.

**Week of Dec. 4-10:** Luke Cooper, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-0, Jr., Eltham, Australia) was voted the Most Valuable Player as he led the Seawolves to two wins in the Glacier Classic. In the two contests, he had 19 points, 16 assists and four steals, including 17 points and six assists in Saturday's win over Augustana. Cooper recorded his 10 th career double-digit assist total against Florida Tech. He now ranks fifth in GNAC history in career assists (416) and is the GNAC all-time leader in assists per game (6.21).

**Week of Dec. 11-17:** Sam Kirby, Seattle (G, 6-0, Sr., Sacramento, CA) and Ryan Schmidt, Western Oregon (F, 6-7, Sr., Keizer, OR – McNary & Linn Benton). . Kirby scored 33 points and also had seven rebounds, four assists and four steals to lead the Redhawks to a sweep of nationally 14th -ranked BYU-Hawaii and Hawaii Pacific on their trip to the Hawaiian Islands. Against BYU-Hawaii, Kirby scored 22 points, hitting eight of 15 shots from the field and four of five free throws. Two nights later against HPU, he scored 11 points, hitting a couple of key three-pointers along the way in a three-point victory. For the season, he is averaging 18.8 points per game and is shooting 53.5 percent from the field, 53.4 on three-pointers and 81.3 percent from the free throw line. . Schmidt scored 63 points and had 12 rebounds to earn all-tournament honors and lead the Wolves to a third-place finish in the Lawrence R. DeBeni Sr. Memorial basketball tournament at Arcata, Calif. He made 20 of 42 shots, including 10 of 15 three-pointers. In four games during the week including losses at Oregon State and Southern Oregon prior to the tournament, he averaged 20.8 points and 6.0 rebounds and connected on 12 of 22 treys.

**Week of Dec. 18-24:** Tim Ireland, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-1, 190, Sr., Bellingham, WA – Whatcom CC) scored 41 points, leading the Crusaders to two road wins at Montana State-Billings. Ireland made 15 of 27 shots, including nine of 17 three-pointers, as NNU completed a three-game season series sweep of the Yellowjackets. In NNU's 90-89 overtime win Thursday, Ireland hit a three-pointer with 1:42 left in overtime to give NNU a 87-86 lead, a game they eventually won on a three-pointer by Justin Parnell with five seconds left. Ireland also had six rebounds and a team-best four steals.

**Week of Dec. 25-31:** Jushay Rockett, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-5, Sr., Long Beach, CA) and Ryan Schmidt, Western Oregon (F, 6-7, Sr., Keizer, OR – McNary & Linn-Benton). . Rockett, who leads the GNAC in scoring (22.3) and rebounding (9.6), scored 50 points and also had 21 rebounds, four steals and five blocks to lead the Nanooks to wins over Hawaii Hilo and nationally 19 th -ranked BYU-Hawaii in the AT&T Alascom Jamboree at Anchorage. Rockett, who scored 33 against the Seaside, connected on 19 of 32 shots and had eight offensive rebounds, in earning all-tournament honors for the fourth time this winter. . Schmidt scored 33 points in a 84-81 win over Shepherd and had 49 points total to earn MVP honors in the Red Lion Classic at Monmouth. Schmidt made 16 of 27 shots (59.3 percent) and also had seven rebounds and nine assists. His three-pointer with 31 seconds left snapped a 78-78 tie against the Rams.

**Week of Jan. 1-7:** Brendan Campbell, Saint Martin's (F, 6-5, Jr., Bremerton, WA – Olympic) and Ryan Webb, Seattle (G, 6-1, Sr., Mountlake Terrace). . Campbell and Webb led their teams to conference-opening victories. Campbell, who ranks second in the GNAC in rebounding averaging 8.5 per game, scored 22 points on seven of 11 shooting and had six rebounds in a one-point home win over Western Oregon. . Webb tied his career high with 18 points – more than double his season average of 7.8 - to lead the Redhawks to

a 13-point road win at Nampa. During a 20-3 run to break the game open, Webb scored six points and dished out two assists. He made eight of 12 shots from the field and both his free throw attempts and also earned five assists. On the season, Webb is shooting 50.8 percent from the field and 88.0 percent from the free throw line. He also leads the squad with 85 assists and is second with 20 steals.

**Week of Jan. 8-14:** Jake Linton, Saint Martin's (G, 5-10, So., Lynnwood, WA – Meadowdale) and Carl Arts, Alaska Anchorage (F, 6-6, Jr., Valdez, AK) . Linton scored 41 points as the Saints earned a road sweep of Central Washington and Seattle to extend their win streak to five games. Linton scored a game-high 21 points in Thursday's 11-point win at Ellensburg, then netted 20 points, including a pair of baskets to break a 57-57 tie in a 74-64 win at Seattle. He also had eight rebounds, five assists and three steals. . Arts scored a career-high 27 points, converting on 10 of 15 field goal attempts and six of seven free throws, had also had 10 rebounds, two assists, two blocks and three steals as the Seawolves rallied from an eight-point halftime deficit to beat Northwest Nazarene.

**Week of Jan. 15-21:** David White, Seattle (C, 6-11, Sr., Seattle, WA – Bellevue CC) and Jake Linton, Saint Martin's (G, 5-10, So., Lynnwood, WA – Meadowdale). . White scored 30 points and also had 22 rebounds in leading the Redhawks to an overtime road win at Central Washington and a 18-point home win against Seattle Pacific. He tied his career high against CWU with 17 points on seven of 11 shooting and also had nine rebounds and two blocks. He then made six of eight shots against SPU and finished with 13 points, 13 rebounds and one block. . Linton scored 49 points and also had 16 assists and just one turnover as the Saints ran their win streak to seven with home victories against UAA and UAF. He converted on 16 of 34 shots, including eight of 14 three-pointers, and was perfect from the foul line (9-9).

**Week of Jan. 22-28:** Lance Den Boer, Central Washington (F, 6-6, Sr., Sunnyside, WA – Sunnyside Christian) exploded for 38 points, including 26 after the intermission, as the Wildcats beat Seattle Pacific 98-91 in overtime. Den Boer made 11 of 17 shots, five of eight from beyond the arc. He was also perfect from the foul line in 11 attempts where he is the GNAC career percentage leader making 88.8 percent of his attempts.

**Week of Jan. 29-Feb. 4:** Kenny Barker, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-3, Jr., San Diego, CA – Clairemont) and Rob Will, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-10, Jr., Seattle, WA – O'Dea & Bellevue CC). . Barker scored 46 points and also had 15 rebounds to lead the Nanooks to wins over Saint Martin's and Western Oregon. He had 18 of his game-high 24 points in the second half in an eight-point win over the Saints, then scored 15 of his 22 points after intermission, including a three-pointer with four seconds left, in a 79-76 win over Western Oregon. Barker, who had a dozen rebounds against the Wolves, connected on 14 of 32 shots, including four of eight three-pointers. . Will led the Falcons to home wins over Northwest Nazarene and Seattle, scoring 43 points and pulling in 10 rebounds. He made 16 of 21 shots

and 11 of 12 free throws as the Falcons moved into first-place in the tightly contested GNAC race.

**Week of Feb. 5-11:** Bryan Freshwater, Central Washington (C, 6-8, Sr., Vancouver, WA – Columbia River) scored 39 points and also had 11 rebounds as the Wildcats earned back-to-back road wins against the GNAC's first-place team to extend their win streak to five games. On Thursday at Brougham Pavilion, he scored 17 points and had five rebounds as the Wildcats beat Seattle Pacific 80-73 to knock the Falcons out of first-place. The on Saturday, he scored 22 points and grabbed six rebounds in a 103-85 win over Saint Martin's, which had moved into the conference's top-rung following SPU's loss. In the two games, Freshwater made 16 of 24 shots. On the season he ranks third in the GNAC in field goal percentage (58.1). In conference games, he ranks third in field goal percentage (58.4), fifth in rebounds (6.3) and 13 th in scoring (6.6).

**Week of Feb. 12-18:** Ryan Webb, Seattle University (G, 6-1, Sr., Mountlake Terrace, WA) and Louie Beech, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-1, Fr., Nampa, ID). . . Webb scored 25 points and played a key role in crucial road wins at Anchorage and Fairbanks. . Against UAA he scored 15 points (5-12 FGs, 5-7 FTs) and also had five assists, including one on David White's jumper with 27 seconds remaining to increase the Redhawks' lead to four points. He then made two free throws with seven seconds left to give Seattle its final three-point margin in a 69-66 win. Against Alaska Fairbanks, he led the Redhawks with 10 points (5-9 FGs). He also had five rebounds, two assists and a steal with 1:35 remaining to provide Seattle with its first and only lead of the game in a 50-48 victory. He then pulled down an offensive rebound with less than a minute left to help SU keep possession of the ball. Webb became the fourth player in school history to earn 500 career assists with his first helper against UAA and now has 506 career assists, which ranks fourth in GNAC history. . Beech scored 36 points on 12 of 21 shooting and also had five assists, three steals and six rebounds in wins over Saint Martin's and Western Oregon. He scored 10 consecutive points late in the first half in a 12-0 surge against the Saints, then hit a three-pointer at the buzzer to give NNU a lead at the half, a lead it never relinquished, on the way to a career-high 21 points against the Wolves.

**Week of Feb. 19-25:** Ryan Webb, Seattle University (G, 6-1, Sr., Mountlake Terrace, WA) and Jacob Mitchell, Western Oregon (F, 6-7, Sr., Olympia, WA – Capital – Pierce). . . Webb scored 34 points, pulled down 12 rebounds, and dished out 16 assists as Seattle University extended its win streak to five games (four of them on the road) and moved within a half-game of the conference lead with victories over Saint Martin's and Northwest Nazarene. Against the Saints, he scored a career-high 24 points on 11 of 13 shooting. He also earned seven rebounds and nine assists as the Redhawks jumped out to a 19-1 lead and cruised to the 13-point win. Webb played another solid all-around game in Saturday's overtime win over Northwest Nazarene, earning 10 points, five rebounds, and seven assists. Among his assists were two at the end of regulation and the beginning of overtime. . Mitchell scored a game-

high 32 points, including a game-winning tip-in at the buzzer, lifting Western Oregon to a two-point overtime home victory over Western Washington. He made 13 of 20

**Week of Feb. 26-Mar. 4:** Leigh Swanson, Seattle University (Forward, 6-8, So., Mountlake Terrace, WA) and Lance Den Boer, Central Washington (Forward, 6-6, Sr., Sunnyside, WA – Sunnyside Christian). . .Swanson had 26 points and 16 rebounds as the Redhawks earned the GNAC's automatic berth in the NCAA West Regionals beating Central Washington and Western Oregon. He had 15 points on seven of 11 shooting, seven rebounds and two steals in Thursday's 88-73 win over CWU, then scored the final five points in a 10-0 run early in the second half in Saturday's victory against Western Oregon. In the two contests, he made 12 of 22 shots. . Den Boer scored 69 points, recording his fifth and sixth 30-point games of the season, as the Wildcats split two contests. Den Boer made 23 of 36 shots, nine of 15 from the three-point line. He also had 12 rebounds. His six 30-point games tied the GNAC record set by Alaska Fairbanks' Brad Oleson in 2004-05. He finished his career with 12 30-point contests, one off the GNAC record of 13 set by Humboldt State's Austin Nichols between 2001 and 2004.

**Week of Mar. 5-11:** Sam Kirby, Seattle University (Guard, 6-0, Sr., Sacramento, CA – San Joaquin Delta) scored 29 points, connecting on six of 13 three-pointers and nine of 11 free throws as the Redhawks split two games in the NCAA West Regionals, upsetting third-seed Cal Poly Pomona to extend their win streak to eight games before losing narrowly to No. 2 Cal State San Bernardo. Kirby also had eight rebounds, four assists and three steals.

**Week of Nov. 12-18:** Adam Shildmyer, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-5, Jr., Bremerton, WA – King's West & Olympic CC) shot 65 percent from the floor (13 of 20) and scored a team-best 34 points as the Crusaders, who were picked to finish seventh in the GNAC Coaches' poll, opened their 2007-08 season with wins over Chico State and Notre Dame de Namur in the Tarp-It Classic at Ellensburg. Shildmyer scored 12 of his 16 points in the second-half in Friday's 14-point win over Chico State, then scored a game-high 18 in a four-point win over Notre Dame de Namur to earn all-tournament honors.

**Week of Nov. 19-25:** Ira Graham, Western Washington (G, 6-1, Jr., Fontana, CA) and Brad Krichevsky, Western Oregon (G, 5-10, Sr., Beaverton, OR – Pacific). . .Graham scored 34 points (12-23 FG, 1-4 3-FG, 9-11 FTs) to earn MVP honors in the 10 th annual Chuck Randall Classic. He also had five rebounds, three steals and seven assists. In three wins, including a 12-point victory over Cal State Monterey Bay on Monday, Graham netted 66 points on 60 percent shooting (24-40) and had 10 rebounds, five steals and 11 assists and did not commit a turnovers. He made four of nine treys and 14 of 16 free throws. . Krichevsky scored 36 points as the Wolves split two games at the North Dakota Invitational, defeating 15 th ranked Montevallo 80-73 before losing on a shot with four seconds left to host

North Dakota 60-58. Krichevsky, who also had nine steals, made 12 of 24 shots, eight of 17 from the arc. He also had six assists

**Week of Nov. 26-Dec. 2:** Kendall Gielow, Northwest Nazarene (F, 6-7, So., Medford, OR – South Medford) scored 31 points and also had seven rebounds and four assists as the Crusaders won a pair of games to improve to 4-0. Gielow made 13 of 21 shots, three of five from the three-point line.

**Week of Dec. 3-9:** Carl Arts, Alaska Anchorage (F, 6-6, Sr., Valdez, AK) and Joel Ryman, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-0, Jr., Spokane, WA – Northwest Christian). .Arts scored 34 points and also had 21 rebounds, six assists and three steals to lead the Seawolves to two wins over Texas-Permian Basin. He became the 31 st member of the GNAC 1,000-point club in the process increasing his career total to 1,017. He is the GNAC career active leader in both points and rebounds, ranking 15 th in the latter category with 551. .Ryman came off the bench to score 36 points leading the Crusaders to a pair of wins and the team championship in the Wendy's Classic at Caldwell, Idaho. Ryman made seven of 12 three-pointers, including back-to-back treys during a key 10-0 run in Saturday's 80-70 win over Montana Western. Ryman made 10 of 18 shots overall and nine of 10 free throws.

**Week of Dec. 17-23:** Marques Echols, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, Sr., Seattle, WA – Garfield & Peninsula CC) scored 58 points in leading the Falcons to wins over Colorado Mines and BYU-Hawaii in the BYU-Hawaii Holiday Classic. Echols made 23 of 37 shots, including 11 of 20 three-pointers and also had seven rebounds, nine assists and four steals. He scored 33 points, 27 in the second-half in Saturday's 75-73 road win against the nationally ninth ranked Seaside as the Falcons improved to 6-1.

**Week of Dec. 24-30:** Chris Bryant, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-4, Sr., Metlakatla, AK) and Nate Jackson, Central Washington (G, 6-0, Sr., Seattle, WA – Cleveland & HCC). .Bryant was selected the Most Outstanding Player as he led the Seawolves to two wins in the AT&T Alascom Jamboree at Anchorage. The Drake transfer scored 40 points, connecting on 15 of 27 shots, including nine of 19 treys. He also had 10 rebounds, five assists and three steals. The two wins improved UAA's Division II record to a perfect 9-0. .Jackson scored 28 points and also had four rebounds, four assists and five steals as CWU earned wins over Sonoma State and Concordia, Ore., in the Phoenix Inn & Suites Classic at Monmouth. The CWU point guard made 11 of 13 shots and was selected to the all-tournament team.

**Week of Dec. 31-Jan. 6:** McCade Olsen, Alaska Anchorage (F, 6-8, Sr., Riverton, UT – Eastern Wyoming) scored 36 points and had 12 rebounds in leading the Seawolves to two road victories. Olsen made 14 of 23 shots and also had three assists in the two wins, which included a GNAC record-setting defensive performance in a 66-42 victory at Saint Martin's. In the latter game, he held the

Saints' Bill Richardson to four points, nine below his season average.

**Week of Jan. 7-13:** Jake Beitinger, Central Washington (F, 6-8, Jr., Port Orchard, WA – South Kitsap) and Luke Cooper, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-0, Sr., Melbourne, Australia). .Beitinger, a transfer from Eastern Washington, scored 39 points and pulled down 21 rebounds as the Wildcats swept a pair of home games. Beitinger had 17 rebounds against Saint Martin's, the most for a CWU player since 2001. He also blocked three shots against the Saints. .Cooper tied his own GNAC single-game record with 16 assists increasing his GNAC career-record total to 704 as the Seawolves extended their win streak to 10 with a 20-point win against Alaska Fairbanks. Cooper, who had just one turnover in playing all 40 minutes, also had three rebounds and made his only field goal attempt on the evening.

**Week of Jan. 14-20:** Mike McLaughlin, Western Oregon (F, 6-7, So., Lake Oswego, OR) and Jake Linton, Saint Martin's (G, 5-10, Jr., Lynnwood, WA – Meadowdale). .McLaughlin and Linton led their respective teams to a pair of wins, including victories over defending GNAC co-champion Seattle University. McLaughlin scored 36 points, connecting on 16 of 23 shots, and also had 14 rebounds and four assists as the Wolves earned their first two conference wins of the season, defeating the Redhawks 78-72 and Montana State Billings 85-72. .Linton took just 11 shots, but helped produce 59 points in wins over the Yellowjackets (81-52) and Seattle U. (88-77). He made seven of 11, including six of eight three-pointers and was perfect (16-16) at the foul line. In addition to his 36 points, he also had 11 assists and six steals and just two turnovers. His 11 assists led to an additional 23 Saint points.

**Week of Jan. 28-Feb. 3:** Luke Cooper, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-0, Sr., Melbourne, Australia), who was named one of 16 finalists for the Bob Cousy Award Friday, scored 30 points and had 19 assists to lead the Seawolves to home wins over 24th ranked Seattle Pacific and 23rd ranked Northwest Nazarene. Cooper had a season-high 18 points and eight assists against NNU and 12 points and 11 assists against Seattle Pacific to record his third double-double of the season as UAA became the first team in GNAC history to finish the first-half of the conference season unbeaten.

**Week of Feb. 4-10:** Michael Wright, Seattle University (F, 6-5, Jr., Lakewood, WA - Pierce) scored 29 points and also had 10 rebounds, five assists and seven steals as the Redhawks put themselves back into the race for a NCAA post-season playoff berth with road wins at Northwest Nazarene and Seattle Pacific. Wright missed just three shots (14 of 17) in the two contests and had key steals and key rebounds in the wins at NNU and SPU, respectively.

**Week of Feb. 11-17:** Johnny Spevak, Central Washington (G, 6-3, Jr., Edgewood, WA – Puyallup) earned an assist on the game-winning basket and played outstanding defense in leading the Wildcats to an overtime win over Alaska Anchorage, snapping the Seawolves' 18-game win streak. Spevak had the main defensive responsibility on Chris

Bryant, who was held to three points, 10 below his average. In addition to his defense (team-high four steals) and play-making contributions (5 assists), he scored 15 points, connecting on six of 12 shots, including three of seven three-pointers as the Wildcats won a pair of games. He also had seven rebounds and did not commit a foul in the two home wins.

**Weeks of Jan. 21-27 and Feb. 18-24:** Carl Arts, Alaska Anchorage (F, 6-6, Sr., Valdez, AK) scored 40 points and had 19 rebounds to key a two-game road sweep on Jan. 24 and Jan. 26 as the Seawolves tied a school record with their 13th and 14th consecutive victories. Arts made 15 of 26 shots and eight of nine free throws. Seven of his rebounds came at the offensive end. During the Week of Feb. 18-24, Arlt scored 44 points and also pulled down 11 rebounds as the Seawolves protected their No. 1 regional ranking with a pair of home wins. Arts made 18 of 26 shots (69.2 percent), including all three of his three-point attempts. He also was five of six from the foul line.

**Week of Feb. 25-March 2:** Rob Will, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-10, Sr., Seattle, WA – O'Dea) was nearly perfect converting on 21 of 22 shots as the Falcons solidified their No. 3 West Regional ranking and all but clinched a playoff berth with wins over Alaska Fairbanks and regionally top-ranked Alaska Anchorage. Will, who set a GNAC record by making 22 consecutive shots going back to SPU's previous contest at Western Oregon on Feb. 23, finished the week with 48 points, 17 rebounds and five blocked shots.

**Week of Mar. 3-9:** Matt Penoncello, Central Washington (G, 6-5, Jr., Moscow, ID) and Bill Richardson, Saint Martin's (F, 6-7, Jr., Shelton, WA – Grays Harbor CC). . Penoncello scored 61 points, including a GNAC season-high 34 in a 105-96 overtime win over Seattle Pacific, as the Wildcats closed out their season with a 10-game winning streak, the longest current streak in the region. In two wins, Penoncello made 18 of 35 shots, including five of nine three-pointers. He also converted on 20 of 22 free throws, had 17 rebounds (10 at the offensive end), four assists and four steals. . Richardson scored 50 points as the Saints split two overtime games in Alaska. Richardson shot at a 69.0 percent clip, making 20 of 29 attempts (12 of 13 against Alaska Anchorage) and also had team-highs of 17 rebounds and five blocked shots.

**Week of Mar. 10-17:** McCade Olsen, Alaska Anchorage (F, 6-8, Sr., Riverton, UT – Eastern Wyoming) was selected the Most Outstanding Player in the NCAA West Regional. In three games, Olsen scored 69 points and also had 14 rebounds, six assists, two blocks and five steals. He made 24 of 41 field goal attempts, four of seven three-pointers and all 17 of his free throw attempts in leading the Seawolves to their first regional title since 1988 when they reached the NCAA Division II national championship contest.

**Week of Nov. 10-16:** Blake Poole, Saint Martin's (F, 6-5, So., Eugene, OR – Sheldon) and Michael Hall, Montana State Billings (G, 6-2, Sr., Dayton, Ohio – Idaho). . Poole scored 29 points and also had 21 rebounds to earn all-tournament honors and lead the Saints to two West Region victories in the Elgin Baylor Tip-Off tournament at Seattle University. Poole recorded his third and fourth double-doubles of the season in wins against Notre Dame De Namur (15 points, 10 rebound) and Chico State (14 points, 11 rebounds). He shot at a 61.9 percent clip (13-21) and also had four assists and a team-best five steals in the two wins. . Hall scored 24 points, connecting on five of 12 three-point shots, in a 83-52 loss to national powerhouse Gonzaga. Hall scored 14 consecutive points in the final three minutes of the first half as the Yellowjackets cut a 33-14 deficit to 33-28 at the break. He also scored 32 points, connecting on 13 of 23 shots, including six of 14 treys, in a 96-91 exhibition win over Dickinson State.

**Week of Nov. 17-23:** Bill Richardson, Saint Martin's (C, 6-8, Sr. Shelton, WA – Grays Harbor) and Jeff Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-4, So., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian). . Richardson scored 46 points and also had 25 rebounds in earning Most Valuable Player honors in the WOU Phoenix Inn D2 Shootout at Monmouth. Richardson, who also blocked four shots, made 16 of 28 shots in leading the Saints to the team title. In three games during the week, he had 57 points, 31 rebounds and five blocks as the Saints extended their win streak to five games. . Downs had 38 points, 14 rebounds and seven assists in leading the Falcons to two wins in the Sodexo Tip-Off tournament at Brougham Pavilion. Downs, who made nine of 16 three-pointers, scored 22 points in a 104-94 overtime win over Cal State San Bernardino. Downs had a buzzer-beating equalizer at the end of regulation and a game-tying three-pointer in the first overtime enabling the Falcons to win the contest in the second overtime.

**Week of Nov. 24-30:** Jake Linton, Saint Martin's (G, 5-11, Sr., Lynnwood, WA – Meadowdale) scored 46 points and had eight assists while committing just two turnovers in wins at Division I Colorado State and at Bellingham against Cameron, Okla. The Saints extended their win streak to seven, matching their longest streak of the decade. They also won seven straight two years ago. Linton, who made nine of 22 three-point shots and 15 of 17 free throws, also had seven rebounds and two steals. He is the GNAC's active career point leader and ranks 11th overall with 1,588.

**Week of Dec. 1-7:** Chris Banchemo, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, So., Seattle, WA – O'Dea) scored 45 points and also had nine rebounds to earn Most Valuable Player honors in leading the Falcons to two wins in the Chuck Stephens Classic at Pueblo, Colo. Banchemo scored 22 points, including five during a closing 9-0 run in Friday's 61-56 win over Regis. He then added 23 points in a 73-60 win over host Colorado State Pueblo. Banchemo made 19 of 30 shots, including three of six three-pointers, in the two contests.

**Week of Dec. 8-14:** Kenny Barker, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-3, Sr., San Diego, CA – Clairemont) and Emmanuel Jenkins, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-0, Jr., Tacoma, WA – Tacoma CC). . .Barker and Jenkins led their respective teams to two wins each in the Glacier Classic at the Patty Center. Barker scored 55 points and also had 15 rebounds, six assists and five steals. He shot 58.1 percent from the floor (18 of 31), including five of nine three-pointers. Jenkins scored 52 points , 32 in a 77-73 win over Virginia State, and added eight assists and seven rebounds. He made 23 of 37 shots (62.2 percent).

**Week of Dec. 15-21:** Travis Kuhns, Western Oregon (F, 6-8, Sr., Salem, OR – Sprague) and Galen Squiers, Saint Martin's (G, 6-2, So., Redmond, WA). . .Kuhns was named the Most Valuable Player as he led the Wolves to two wins in the DeBeni Holiday Classic at Arcata. Kuhns had 42 points, including 27 in a 85-76 win over Humboldt State. It was the first loss for the 'Jacks in the six-year history of the tournament and it was also WOU's first win in Arcata against HSU since 1996. Kuhns, who made 14 of 22 shots, also had 15 rebounds, seven assists and four steals. . .Squiers came off the bench to make strong contributions both offensively and defensively and he also made the most dramatic last-second shot in GNAC history as the Saints extended their win streak to 11 with a pair of victories in Hawaii. He scored a career-high 16 points in a 92-91 win at Hawaii Hilo, coming up with a steal and then launching a game-winning 75-footer at the buzzer as the Saints shocked the Vulcans. In the two games, Squiers also had five assists and four steals. "Galen played outstanding defense in both of our wins," SMU coach Keith Cooper said. "We believe he and Justin (Alexander) are two of the best defensive stoppers in the entire conference."

**Week of Dec. 29-Jan. 4:** Travis Bunker, MSU Billings (F, 6-6, Sr., Beaver, UT – U. Wyoming) led the Yellowjackets to a pair of wins, including a Division II victory over Chadron State. Bunker scored 29 points and also had 18 rebounds, 11 assists and four steals. Most of his points came from the three-point line where he made six of 14 shots.

**Week of Jan. 5-11:** Stanley Ratcliff, Western Oregon (F, 6-3, Sr., Palmer, AK) and Casey Reed, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-5, Sr., Canby, OR). . .Ratcliff and Reed led their respective teams to wins over nationally 13 th ranked Saint Martin's. Ratcliff scored 14 points, pulled down nine rebounds and tied a GNAC single-game record for conference games with eight steals against the Saints. In WOU's two games including a loss at BYU, Ratcliff had 26 points shooting at a 75 percent clip (12 of 16), 11 rebounds and nine steals. Ratcliff was largely responsible for holding SMU center Bill Richardson to six points in Saturday's win. "Stanley had an outstanding game defensively," WOU coach Craig Stanger said. "He is deceptively strong and quick which enables him to be effective inside against bigger players." . . .Reed scored 31 points in wins over Saint Martin's and MSU Billings, connecting on 12 of 17 shots. He also had seven rebounds and team-highs of nine assists and three blocks. "He is a steadying influence on the court for us," SPU coach Jeff Hironaka said.

**Week of Jan. 12-18:** Matt Penoncello, Central Washington (G, 6-5, Sr., Moscow, ID – EWU) and Michael Hall, Montana State Billings (G, 6-2, Sr., Dayton, Ohio) each averaged 30 points in leading their respective teams to a pair of wins. . .Penoncello scored 60 points in wins over Seattle Pacific and Saint Martin's, netting a career-high 36 in the latter game including six during a crucial 9-0 run late in the contest. Penoncello made 23 of 42 shots, eight of 18 from the three-point arc. He also led the Wildcats with 18 rebounds. . .Hall had 63 points, 36 of them in a double-overtime win over Alaska Fairbanks. He was 20 of 42, 10 of 25 from the arc. Hall has helped lead the Yellowjackets, who won just one game a year ago, to seven victories this season.

**Week of Jan. 19-25:** Steve Alford, Western Washington (F, 6-5, Sr., Bakersfield, CA) scored 18 points, connecting on all four of his three-point attempts, and also had five rebounds, three assists and four steals to lead the Vikings to only their third ever 20-point win at Ellensburg and their first in 49 years. Most of his points came in key situations as he scored the last 10 points of a 20-4 run, including a dunk and two three-pointers, as Western Washington opened up 29-15 lead midway through the first period in a 95-75 victory at Nicholson Pavilion.

**Week of Jan. 26-Feb.1:** Ira Graham, Western Washington (G, 6-2, Sr., Fontana, CA) and Brandon Foote, Central Washington (G, 6-3, Sr., Bellingham, WA – Whatcom CC) each led their teams to two victories as the Vikings and Wildcats moved into a virtual tie for first place in the GNAC. Graham scored 37 points, including 28 in a 81-73 overtime win over Northwest Nazarene. Graham stole the ball and scored the tying basket in the final minute of regulation against NNU, then put the Vikings ahead in the overtime with a three-pointer. In the two contests, Graham made 16 of 28 shots and also had nine assists and eight rebounds. . .Foote made his first start of the season and had career highs for points (27), rebounds (12) and assists (7) in a 91-83 win at Seattle Pacific. In two contests, he netted 34 points connecting on 11 of 18 shots and all 11 of his foul shots.

**Week of Feb. 2-8:** Morris Anderson, Western Washington (G, 6-3, Jr., Federal Way, WA – Highline CC) figured in nearly one-third of the Vikings' points in road wins at University of Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks. Anderson scored 32 points on 60.0 percent shooting (12 of 20) and also had a team-best 10 assists. Anderson, who made five of nine treys, also led the team in rebounds (13) and shared the team lead in steals (4). WWU has now won five straight contests and nine of its last 10.

**Week of Feb. 9-15:** Travis Kuhns, Western Oregon (F, 6-8, Sr., Salem, OR - Sprague) and Chris Banchemo, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, So., Seattle, WA – O'Dea). . .Kuhns, who ranks 18 th in GNAC history with 1,340 career points, netted 56 points as the Wolves lost a narrow six-point decision at Seattle Pacific, then upset GNAC leader Western Washington at Monmouth. Kuhns made 18 of 32 shots, including nine of 15 treys. He also accounted for nearly a third (11 of 36) of WOU's assists. . .Banchemo

scored 47 points to lead the Falcons to a pair of wins as they pulled to within half a game of conference leader Western Washington. Banchemo made 17 of 24 shots (70.8). He also had six assists and five steals.

**Week of Feb. 16-22:** Tyler Nixon, Saint Martin's (F, 6-6, Sr., Sumner, WA – White River) and Brian Barkdoll, Northwest Nazarene (C, 6-10, So., Portland, OR – Central Catholic). . Nixon scored 34 points, including 27 in a 94-88 win over Northwest Nazarene Thursday as the Saints won their 19th and 20th games of the season reaching that plateau for the first time since 1991-92 and only the sixth time in 40 years. Nixon, who came into Thursday's contest averaging seven points a game, made 13 of 22 shots, including six of 12 three-pointers. Barkdoll scored 44 points and also had 24 rebounds and six assists as the Crusaders earned a split on their road trip to Lacey and Monmouth. Barkdoll made 16 of 22 shots and 12 of 15 free throws.

**Week of Feb. 23-Mar. 1:** Brian Barkdoll, Northwest Nazarene (P, 6-10, So., Portland, OR – Central Catholic) scored 32 points and also had 22 rebounds and six assists to lead the Crusaders to wins over Alaska Fairbanks and Alaska Anchorage. Barkdoll has had double-doubles in three of his last four games, averaging 19 points and 11 ½ rebounds and shooting 67.5 percent (27 of 40). He made 11 of 18 shots against the Nanooks and Seawolves and had 17 rebounds against UAA. NNU has won three straight games after ending a seven-game losing streak.

**Week of Mar. 2-8:** Morris Anderson, Western Washington (G, 6-3, Jr., Federal Way, WA – HCC) scored 36 points and also had 18 rebounds, 12 assists and five steals in wins over Seattle Pacific and Central Washington as the Vikings won their first outright GNAC basketball title. Anderson scored a game-high 21 points, fed David Brittain for the go-ahead lay-in with 13.7 seconds left, then blocked a shot at the buzzer as WWU rallied from an eight-point deficit in the final two minutes to beat Seattle Pacific 76-75 on Thursday. Anderson then had a near triple-double (15 points, 13 rebounds, eight assists) as the Vikings overcame a five-point halftime deficit to beat Central Washington 85-68 Saturday and wrap up the No. 2 seed and a host role for this week's NCAA West Regionals. Anderson made 14 of 26 shots and all six of his free throws in the two contests.

## 2009-10

**Week of Nov. 16-22:** Chris Banchemo, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, 185, Jr., Seattle, WA - O'Dea) was selected the Most Valuable Player after leading the Falcons to a pair of 18-point victories in the Sodexo Tip-Off tournament at Brougham Pavilion. Banchemo had 42 points, nearly a quarter of the Falcons' total. He also had seven rebounds, four assists and four steals, connecting on 12 of 26 shots and 17 of 18 free throws in the two victories.

**Week of Nov. 23-29:** Brandon Walker, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-3, Jr., Hayward, CA - Bishop O'Dowd) and Brian Barkdoll, Northwest Nazarene (C, 6-10, 253, Jr., Portland, OR - Central Catholic). . Walker put up some amazing

numbers considering the quality of the opposition, scoring 69 points - 27 against Washington State and 21 against both Nicholls State and Houston - to lead UAA to a fourth-place finish in the Great Alaska Shootout. His shooting percentages were particularly impressive as he shot 66.7 percent (24 of 36) from the floor, 62.5 percent from the three-point line (10-16) and 84.6 on free throws (11-13). He also led the Seawolves with 17 rebounds and three steals and also had seven assists in earning all-tournament honors. . Barkdoll led the Crusaders to the title in their own Thanksgiving Classic, scoring 34 points and grabbing 13 rebounds. He made 13 of 18 shots, including 10 of 11 in a 15-point win over Dixie State as NNU improved to 3-0 on the season.

**Week of Nov. 30-Dec. 6:** Blake Poole, Saint Martin's (F, 6-5, 275, Jr., Eugene, OR - Shelton) and Chris Banchemo, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, 185, Jr., Seattle, WA - O'Dea). . Poole scored 55 points and had 32 rebounds as the Saints split two games in Phoenix. The Saint forward shot 70 percent from the floor (21-30) and also had eight assists. Seventeen of his rebounds came at the offensive end. On the season, he is the GNAC leader in scoring and rebounding. . Banchemo scored 28 points, 20 in a 78-72 win over top-ranked BYU-Hawaii. Banchemo made 14 of 19 shots, including crucial back-to-back baskets inside the final two minutes against the Seaside. He also had eight assists and three steals in earning all-tournament honors.

**Week of Dec. 7-13:** Casey Robinson, Alaska Anchorage (F, 6-6, Jr., Manila, UT) led the Seawolves offensively and defensively to a pair of victories in the UAF Glacier Classic. At the offensive end, he scored 30 points, converting on 10 of 20 shots, including six of 12 three-pointers, and had four rebounds. On the defensive end, he had five rebounds and six steals and helped hold the two opposing starting power forwards to a combined six points on two of eight shooting. Robinson and his teammates held Grand Canyon scoreless for the first nine minutes and to a total of 10 first-half points in Saturday's 67-38 victory.

**Week of Dec. 14-21:** Parrish West, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-5, 190, Jr., Chicago, IL - Highland CC) scored 44 points and also had 12 rebounds, six assists and four steals in wins over Chaminade and Western New Mexico in the AT&T Jamboree at Anchorage. West had 27 points on 13 of 16 shooting and also had seven rebounds and four steals, rallying the Nanooks from a five-point halftime deficit in a 83-77 win over Chaminade, then netted 17 points and also had six assists and five rebounds in a 13-point win over Western New Mexico.

**Week of Dec. 28-Jan. 3:** Morris Anderson, Western Washington (G, 6-3, Sr., Federal Way, WA - Highline CC) scored 35 points and also had 13 assists, eight rebounds and five steals in leading the Vikings to wins over Dixie State and SUNY - Geneseo as Western extended its winning streak to 12 games, equaling the sixth longest streak in GNAC history. Anderson made 12 of 23 shots, including seven of 16 three-pointers in the two contests. He had 17 of his 24 points in the second half as WWU rallied from an 11-point deficit to defeat Dixie State 81-73. The Viking

guard then scored all 11 of his points during a 28-6 run as Western built an early 33-11 lead and also had 11 assists in a 12-point win over SUNY-Geneseo.

**Week of Jan. 4-10:** Jon Clift, Central Washington (G, 5-10, Sr., Spokane, WA - Ferris) and Blake Poole, Saint Martin's (F, 6-5, Jr., Eugene, OR - Sheldon). . Clift led the Wildcats to two wins, scoring 34 points including a career-high 23 in a four-point road win at Northwest Nazarene. In a critical junction of the game, he scored eight straight points to rally the Wildcats from a four-point deficit. Clift also had four rebounds, four assists and two steals. . Poole scored 54 points and also had 26 rebounds, nine assists and five steals as the Saints split two contests, beating nationally 14th ranked Western Washington in triple overtime before losing to No. 17 Seattle Pacific. Poole had 30 points and 14 rebounds against WWU, including his first three-pointer of the season to force the third overtime session. He then had 2 4 points and 12 rebounds against the Falcons, earning his league-best eighth double-double of the season.

**Week of Jan. 11-17:** Drew Eisinger, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-3, 170, Jr., Mill Creek, WA – Jackson) scored 47 points, including a NNU season high 33 in a 101-86 win at Western Oregon. Eisinger made 14 of 23 shots, including his last eight attempts against WOU. He also made five of six treys and 14 of 15 foul shots. His 33-point total is the second highest this winter in the GNAC. He also added eight rebounds, seven assists and a team-high six steals.

**Week of Jan. 18-24:** Brandon Larrieu, Seattle Pacific (W, 6-0, 175, Sr., Puyallup, WA – Franklin Pierce) and Matt Schmidt, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, Sr., Keizer, OR – McNary). . Larrieu scored 34 points and also had seven assists and four steals as the Falcons opened up a two-game lead in the GNAC race in the loss column with wins at Western Washington and at home against Montana State Billings. Larrieu scored a team-high 18 points against Western Washington, including a fadeaway jumper with 1:12 left to snap a 66-66 tie in a 73-66 victory. He then added 16 points against MSUB, connecting on four of six treys. For the week, he made 13 of 23 shots, six of 11 from the three-point line. . Schmidt scored 36 points, shooting 71.4 percent from the floor (10-14), 75 percent from the three-point line (3-4) and 86.7 percent from the free throw line (13-15) to lead the Wolves to a road sweep in Alaska. The WOU forward scored 22 in a 15-point win at Fairbanks and had 14 in a 11-point win at Anchorage as WOU became just the seventh team in GNAC history to earn a sweep on their Alaska road swing. On the season, Schmidt leads the Wolves and ranks 14 th in the conference in scoring averaging 13 ½ points per game.

**Week of Jan. 25-31:** Derrick Webb, Western Washington (F, 6-3, 185, Sr., Port Orchard, WA – South Kitsap & Highline CC) scored 73 points, including 40 in a 112-78 home win over Western Oregon and 33 in a 100-75 road victory at Montana State Billings. His total is the third highest two-game point total in GNAC history. Webb, who is shooting 50.2 percent on the season, made 25 of 32 shots (78.1 percent), including 14 of 19 three-pointers as he

improved his season percentage from the arc to 40.4 percent. He was also nine of 10 from the foul line and had 14 rebounds, six assists and two steals while turning the ball over once in 75 minutes. His 40-point effort against WOU equaled the 10th highest single-game total in GNAC history.

**Week of Feb. 1-7:** Rico Myles, Western Oregon (F, 6-7, Sr., Los Angeles, CA – Crenshaw & Morgan State) scored 42 points and had 23 rebounds to lead the Wolves to three-point wins over Saint Martin's and Central Washington. He had 29 points and 12 rebounds in a 80-77 road win at Saint Martin's. He then had 13 points and 11 rebounds in a 77-74 home win against Central Washington and also made a crucial block to set up a game-winning three-point shot by teammate Blair Wheadon. Myles shot 62.1 percent from the floor (18-29) in the two contests.

**Week of Feb. 8-14:** JC Cook, Central Washington (G, 6-1, 190, Jr., Canby, OR – Clackamas CC) and Nashorn Maynard, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-5, 210, Jr., St. Paul's, St. Kitts). . Cook scored 41 points and had seven rebounds as the Wildcats won a pair of road games in Alaska. Cook made 16 of 30 shots, eight of 18 from the three-point line. He scored 14 of his game-high 19 points in the second half in Saturday's win at Anchorage making four of nine second-half three-pointers including one to give CWU a 51-40 lead with 5:45 remaining. . Maynard scored 59 points and also had 22 rebounds in 12 and 11-point losses to CWU and Western Washington. He had 30 points and 12 rebounds against the Vikings becoming the seventh player in the conference (and the third Nanook) to score 30 in a single game this season. Maynard shot at a 60 percent clip (21-35) from the floor and 85 percent (17-20) from the foul line. Sixteen of his 22 rebounds came off the offensive glass, including 11 (one short of the GNAC single-game record) versus Western Washington.

**Week of Feb. 15-21:** Ryan Sweet, Seattle Pacific (P, 6-7, 215, Jr., Port Orchard, WA – South Kitsap & Whatcom CC) scored 23 points and also had 27 rebounds, six assists and five steals to lead the Falcons to narrow wins over Western Washington and Montana State Billings. Twice, Sweet set career highs in rebounds, pulling down 13 in Thursday's 67-65 home win over Western Washington and 14 in Saturday's 78-75 road victory at Montana State Billings. Sweet, who also had 18 points against MSUB to record his fifth double-double of the season, had the decisive points against the Vikings making two free throws with 44 seconds left to give SPU a 66-65 lead. Then following a missed shot by the Vikings' Morris Anderson, he grabbed the rebound and made one of two free throws with 13 seconds left as SPU scored the game's final five points to overcome a three-point deficit.

**Week of Feb. 22-28:** Rob Diederichs, Seattle Pacific (W, 6-8, Sr., Shoreline, WA – Shorewood) had 30 assists as the Falcons wrapped up their fourth GNAC title in nine years with wins over Central Washington and Saint Martin's. Diederichs, who had only three turnovers in the two contests, set a GNAC single-game record with 19 assists in Thursday's 100-92 home win against the Wildcats then

recorded his fifth double-digit assist game of the season with 11 in a 89-76 road victory at Lacey. Diederichs has averaged 10.2 assists in his last six games to raise his season average to a GNAC-best 6.4 per contest. In addition to leading SPU in assists, he also had team-bests for rebounds (18) and steals (3) in the two victories. He took only five shots, making four and was perfect (4 of 4) from the foul line. His only miss was a three-pointer.

**Week of March 1-7:** DaVell Jackson, Montana State Billings (G, 6-1, Sr., Las Vegas, NV) and Emmanuel Jenkins, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-0, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Franklin Pierce). . Jackson scored 46 points, including 34 in a 92-85 win at Central Washington. He made 17 of 27 shots, including both of his three-point attempts. He also had nine rebounds, nine assists and four steals in the two contests. . Jenkins scored 47 points to lead the Nanooks to home wins against Seattle Pacific and Northwest Nazarene. He had 29 points against the Falcons as UAF rallied from a 18-point second-half deficit to earn a 113-105 overtime victory. He had 18 against the Crusaders including the go-ahead basket with 15 seconds left. Jenkins also had nine assists and seven rebounds in the two victories.

## 2010-11

**Week of Nov. 8-14:** Taylor Rohde, Alaska Anchorage (C, 6-9, Jr., Phoenix, AZ – Arizona State) earned all-tournament honors at Disney's Tip-Off Classic at the Anaheim Convention Center. In three games, the Arizona State transfer scored 45 points, connecting on 14 of 24 shots and 17 of 22 free throws. He also led the Seawolves with 17 rebounds and had their only blocked shot in the tournament. UAA finished the tournament with a 1-2 record, losing to Dixie State and Lewis before defeating UC San Diego.

**Week of Nov. 15-21:** Blake Poole, Saint Martin's (F, 6-5, Sr., Eugene, OR - Sheldon) and Parrish West, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-5, Sr., Chicago, IL – Highland CC). . Poole scored 65 points and also had 35 rebounds, nine assists, six steals and four blocks as the Saints won three games to improve to 4-1 on the season. Poole made 22 of 37 shots, including the decisive basket with 33 seconds remaining as the Saints rallied from a 15-point deficit with 8:10 left to beat Dominican (NY) 75-72 in Saturday's contest. He was named the MVP in the WOU Phoenix Inn Classic. . West averaged 30 points a game, twice netting 32, as the Nanooks won one of three games in the UAF Nanook Classic. He scored 90 points, making 31 of 60 shots and three of seven three-pointers. He also converted on 25 of 34 shots and also had 12 rebounds and seven steals in earning all-tournament honors.

**Week of Nov. 22-28:** Chris Sprinker, Central Washington (C, 6-9, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Curtis/EWU) and Chris Banchemo, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, Sr., Seattle, WA – O'Dea). . Sprinker led the Wildcats to two impressive double-digit victories, including a 71-55 win over nationally 11 th ranked Metro State and a 11-point win over Sonoma State in the Northwest Nazarene Thanksgiving Classic. Both opponents came into the tournament with 2-0

records. Sprinker, who played only 45 minutes in the two contests as he made his season debut, had 36 points, 11 rebounds and blocked seven shots. He made 12 of 20 field goal attempt. "He dominated," CWU coach Greg Sparling said "No one had an answer for him the entire weekend." . Banchemo accounted for 40 percent of Seattle Pacific's points and 39 percent of its assists as the Falcons split two games in the Grand Canyon Invitational. He had 31 points in a six-point loss to Fort Lewis, then scored 34 in an 11-point win over Grand Canyon. Banchemo made 20 of 41 shots, converting on nine of 17 from the three-point line. He also had 13 assists, 10 against the Skyhawks.

**Week of Nov. 29-Dec. 5:** Drew Robinson, Alaska Anchorage (PG, 6-2, Sr., Lehi, UT – Salt Lake CC) orchestrated a Seawolf offense that shot nearly 60 percent from the floor in tournament wins over Hawaii Pacific and two-time Canadian national runner-up British Columbia as the Seawolves emerged as the only unbeaten teams from the Glacier Classic outscoring the Sea Warriors and Thunderbirds by a grand total of 40 points. Robinson had 14 assists and just two turnovers in the two contests, including 11 without a turnover in Friday's win against HPU. He also contributed to UAA's 58.8 shooting percentage (57 of 97), making six of seven, including all five of his attempts in Saturday's win over UBC.

**Week of Dec. 6-12:** Chris Sprinker, Central Washington (C, 6-9, 230, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Curtis & Tacoma CC) scored 22 points, including 16 in the second half as the Wildcats improved to 8-0 with a two-point road win over Saint Martin's. Central rallied from a 28-18 deficit late in the first half. Sprinker also had two blocks increasing his career total to 99. He now ranks 10th in GNAC history on the all-time block list.

**Week of Dec. 13-19:** Chris Banchemo, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-1, 185, Sr., Seattle, WA – O'Dea) led the Falcons to a sweep at the Dominican Invitational scoring 67 points, including a career-high 42 in Saturday's 81-68 win against the Penguins. Banchemo is just the 13th player in GNAC history to score 40 or more points in a single game. In two games, he made 16 of 29 shots and 32 of 36 free throws. He also had six assists and three steals. Banchemo's 42 points against Dominican equals the seventh highest single-game total in GNAC history and is the most since Ryan Diggs of Western Washington scored a GNAC-record 47 against Humboldt State on Mar. 10, 2006.

**Week of Dec. 27-Jan. 2:** Taylor Rohde, Alaska Anchorage (F, 6-9, Jr., Phoenix, AZ – Pinnacle) and John Allen, Western Washington (G, 6-0, 190, So., Brier, WA – Mountlake Terrace). . Rohde led the Seawolves to two road wins as UAA extended its win streak to nine games. The Arizona State transfer had 40 points and 20 rebounds, including 28 points and 15 rebounds in a double-overtime win at Central Washington. That was the first 25/15 performance by a UAA player since Nov., 2004. He made 13 of 24 field goal attempts and 14 of 17 free throws in the two victories. . . Allen, a transfer from Washington State, scored 43 points in Western Washington's 99-92 home win against Simon Fraser Sunday, equaling the Carver Gym

single-game scoring record set by Nick Gibbs of Saint Martin's in 2003. It was also the second highest output in school history (WWU's Ryan Diggs scored 47 in an NCAA Division II tournament game at Seattle in 2006) and the fifth highest in GNAC history.

**Week of Jan. 3-9:** Tarance Glynn, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, 220, So., Molalla, OR) scored 40 points and had 22 rebounds and three blocks to lead the Wolves to a sweep of Western Washington and Simon Fraser. Glynn had 33 points and 14 rebounds in Thursday's 95-80 win against Simon Fraser. He then added seven points and eight rebounds in a 84-81 overtime win against Western Washington. All three of his baskets against the Vikings were crucial, including one with 16 seconds left in regulation and two in the final 18 seconds of the overtime period. His steal set up the field goal that gave his team an 82-81 lead.

**Week of Jan. 10-16:** Blake Poole, Saint Martin's (F, 6-5, Sr., Eugene, OR – Sheldon) scored 26 points and broke his own GNAC single-game record with 24 rebounds, including eight at the offensive end, as the Saints beat Western Oregon 85-54 in a FSN Northwest televised game. Poole, who had 22 rebounds against WOU on Jan. 31, 2009, became just the fourth player in GNAC history and the first since Jason Chivers of Seattle Pacific had 29 points and 20 rebounds against the Saints on Feb. 2, 2005, to produce a 20-point, 20-rebound performance. Poole had a double-double before the second media time out - just 7 1/2 minutes into the contest - as he led the Saints to an early 30-9 lead. He finished the first half with 13 points and 15 rebounds and the game with 12 field goals in 16 attempts. At the defensive end, he drew three offensive charges accounting for three of the first five fouls called on Western Oregon.

**Week of Jan. 17-23:** Brian Barkdoll, Northwest Nazarene (C, 6-10, Sr., Portland, OR – Central Catholic) and Parrish West, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-5, Sr., Chicago, IL – Highland CC). . .Barkdoll scored 38 points and hauled in 26 rebounds leading the Crusaders to home wins over Simon Fraser and Western Washington. Barkdoll, who left Saturday's 88-86 overtime victory against the Vikings with an injury with 3:38 left in regulation, converted on 17 of 22 shots (77.3 percent). In Wednesday's FSN Northwest game against the Clan, he fell two rebounds shy of becoming the fifth player in GNAC history and the second in two weeks to produce a 20-20 game finishing with 22 points and 18 rebounds. . .West continued his assault on the GNAC record book, scoring 77 points and hauling in 16 rebounds as the Nanooks split two games. He had a UAF school-record 43 points in a 96-93 overtime win against Saint Martin's – equaling the fifth highest single-game total in GNAC history – and then added 34 in a 89-85 loss to Western Oregon. On the season, West leads the GNAC – and Division II – in scoring averaging 28.3, well ahead of the GNAC single-season record of 24.4 set by UAF's Brad Oleson during the 2004-05 season. West converted on 27 of 38 shots, including seven of 13 three-pointers, and made 16 of 20 foul shots. He also had five assists and four steals and had just one turnover.

**Week of Jan. 24-30:** Ryan Sweet, Seattle Pacific (P, 6-6, 210, Sr., Port Orchard, WA – South Kitsap) scored 39 points and also had 12 rebounds and 11 assists to lead the Falcons to wins against Western Washington and Western Oregon. Sweet made 15 of 24 shots and seven of seven free throws, including four in the final minute in SPU's 69-61 win against Western Washington. He also had nine rebounds and seven assists in that contest. He followed that up with a career-high 25-point performance as the Falcons rallied from a 12-point second-half deficit to beat Western Oregon. Sweet also contributed defensively, which was an important factor in SPU's come-from-behind victory against Western Oregon.

**Week of Jan. 31-Feb. 6:** Jeff Downs, Seattle Pacific (W, 6-4, 195, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian) led the Falcons offensively and defensively in wins against Saint Martin's, Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks. In the three contests, he scored a team-best 57 points, connecting on 16 of 35 shots, including nine of 24 three-pointers, and 16 of 19 free throws. Defensively, he played a key role, especially Saturday helping hold the Nanooks' Parrish West to six first-half points and 21 overall. That snapped a string of seven consecutive games in which West had scored 30 or more points. "Jeff has done an unbelievable job in this eight-game (winning streak) stretch for us on the other team's best perimeter player," SPU coach Ryan Looney said.

**Week of Feb. 7-13:** Chris Scott, Central Washington (G, 5-7, Sr., Las Vegas, NV – South Puget Sound) sparked a Central defense that had a 45-5 advantage in points off turnovers and a plus 17 takeaway advantage in home wins over Seattle Pacific and Montana State Billings. In the two contests, Scott scored 19 points and also had six assists and seven steals while turning the ball over just once. CWU had 21 steals (compared to just four by its opponents) in the two contests. The Wildcats also had a 23-3 advantage in points off turnovers against SPU and a 23-2 edge in points off turnovers against MSUB in running its win streak to 11. "In the last three or four weeks, Chris' on-ball defense has been unbelievable. He flies around and pressures the ball. He has been a real disruptive force defensively," CWU coach Greg Sparling said.

**Week of Feb. 14-20:** Darius Walker, Northwest Nazarene (F, 6-6, Jr., Tacoma, WA – Foss & Tacoma CC) and Brandon Walker, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-3, Sr., Hayward, CA – Loyola Marymount). . .Darius scored 39 points (13-24 FGs, 13-14 FTs) and had a team-high six steals as the Crusaders ran their win streak to four with road victories at Simon Fraser and Western Washington. During NNU's win streak, Darius is averaging 17 points and 4.3 rebounds and shooting 68.6 percent from the floor and 91.3 from the foul line. That compares to season-long averages of 9.9 points and 3.9 rebounds and percentages of 59.7 and 71.8. . . Brandon scored a career-high 40 points in a five-point win at Western Oregon. In two games, he had team highs of 47 points and 18 rebounds and shot 53.1 percent from the floor (17-32) and 64.7 percent from the arc (11 of 17). Brandon, who helped rally his team from a nine-point second-half deficit, did most of his damage from beyond the arc against

WOU, hitting 10 of 15 three-pointers and 14 of 22 overall. The 10 treys tied the GNAC record set by Issac Gildea of Humboldt State in 2002 and equaled by Derrick Webb of Western Washington last season and broke the UAA record of nine, accomplished four times by two different players. Walker also had 10 rebounds recording his second double-double of the season.

**Week of Feb. 21-27:** Jamar Berry, Central Washington (G, 6-5, 200, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Franklin Pierce & Chaminade) and Robert Mayes, MSU Billings (F, 6-7, 180, Jr., Houston, TX – Casper). . Berry had 46 points as he closed out the season with five consecutive 20-point performances, including 24 in a 83-70 win over Saint Martin's and 22 in a 71-57 defeat of Western Oregon. Berry made 16 of 31 shots, four of nine on three-pointers, and made all 10 of his foul shots to extend his streak of consecutive free throws made to 17. Berry also had nine rebounds and five assists. . Mayes scored 36 points and hauled in 17 rebounds to lead the Yellowjackets to wins over Simon Fraser and Western Washington. Mayes connected on 14 of 21 field goal attempts and eight of 10 free throws as MSUB finished its season with three consecutive victories. He also had three assists and three steals.
